## Who's Lobbying Who in BC?

## Monthly Snapshot - December 31, 2017

The following organizations and consultant lobbyists submitted their registrations under the B.C. Lobbyists Registration Act and they were activated between December 1 and December 31, 2017. Here is a brief summary of lobbying activities organizations and consultant lobbyists have or expect to carry out. - 2. Dave Cyr, a consultant lobbyist, is arranging meetings with several public office holders on behalf of Qanthen Xwegus Management Corporation to develop independence for the Klahoose First Nation through economic opportunities.

The Association for Mineral Exploration BC is lobbying a number of public office holders on a variety of issues including advocating for reliable data on land access and use, advocating for participation in the Mining Jobs Task Force, and advocating for clear and efficient regulatory framework for the use of water for mineral exploration.
- 28. Automotive Retailers Association is lobbing a number of public office holders on a range of topics, including seeking funding for initiatives that support labour attraction and retention in the automotive industry, advocating for improvements in compensation for automotive service providers by ICBC, and continuing to advocate for changes to the Motor Dealer Act and Regulations.
- 29. The BC Building Trades is lobbying several public office holders to increase opportunities for local hire, apprenticeship and access for underrepresented workers on publically funded projects.
- 30. BC LNG Developers Alliance is lobbying a number of Ministers (and their staff) to discuss LNG and its benefits for the province of BC, revenue, jobs and skills development.
- 31. The BC Poverty Reduction Coalition is lobbying a number of public office holders to advocate for the implementation for a provincial poverty reduction plan that would include legislated targets and timelines to significantly reduce poverty and homelessness.
- 32. The British Columbia River Outfitters Association is lobbying the Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture staff to promote a high standard of safety and river operations in the industry, and to initiate, organize and manage programs to improve operations for outfitters.
- 33. The Clean Energy Association of British Columbia is lobbying several public office holders to discuss and promote BC's clean energy sector; specifically, to discuss the environment, climate change, procurement and export opportunities, EPA renewals and the benefits of private clean energy.
- 34. Domtar Inc. is lobbying a number of public office holders to provide input to energy policy to promote competitive playing field for the pulp industry within the province and other jurisdictions.
- 35. First West Credit Union is lobbying several public office holders seeking to address matters related to the taxation of credit unions as well as participating in the review of the Financial Institutions and Credit Union Incorporation Acts.
- 36. Imperial Oil Limited is lobbying a number of public office holders for the repeal or amendment of renewal fuels policies, for the adoption of pro-development fiscal policies for LNG, tax compliance

- planning, advocacy related to site remediation policy and compliance, and advocacy relating to environmental policy.
- 37. The Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association is lobbying several public office holders to affect change on current and related policy and legislation regarding timber pricing and timber supply.
- 38. Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research is lobbying several public office holders to discuss their core mandate and related activities and continued funding for the health research sector.
- 39. Microsoft Canada Inc. is lobbying a number of public office holders to encourage support for their software development operations in the province, and to support Microsoft's efforts to communicate its various activities in BC relating to Microsoft Vancouver.
- 40. Nuuvera Corp. is lobbying Ministry of Agriculture staff, Ministry of Health staff and Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General staff regarding prospective regulations and policies related to cannabis, specifically regulations dealing with the production, distribution and sale of cannabis in BC.
- 41. The Private Forest Landowners Association is lobbying the Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development regarding the de-regulation of private land.
- 42. The Recreation Vehicle Dealers Association of BC is lobbying the Minister of Finance, the Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General, and staff of the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General to allow RV dealers to import NFPA 1192 units from the US without mandatory stickering or alterations, and to ensure fair taxation for campgrounds.
- 43. Rio Tinto is lobbying several public office holders regarding climate change policy and ambient air quality objectives, monitoring and permitting.
- 44. United Steelworks is lobbying several public office holders regarding improving the forestry industry and the mining industry for workers and local communities, improvements to labour legislation and regulations, and steps that can be taken to ensure enforcement of the Westray Law and public inquiry into sawmill explosions in northern BC.
- 45. Western Forest Products is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding workplace safety and policies and regulations regarding volume, competitiveness and certainty for forest operations on the coast of BC.
