Who's Lobbying Who in BC?

Monthly Snapshot - July 2019

The following organizations and consultant lobbyists submitted their registrations under the B.C. Lobbyists Registration Act and they were activated between July 1 and July 31, 2019. Association for Mineral Exploration is lobbying a number of public office holders on a variety of issues, including Species at Risk legislation; land use planning; the regulatory framework for inclusion of input of Indigenous communities in decision making on mineral exploration activities; the regulatory framework regarding use of water for mineral exploration; provincial financial incentives.
- 30. BC Civil Liberties Association is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding the proposed Community Safety Act.
- 31. BC Government and Service Employees' Union is lobbying a number of public office holders on a number of issues including improvements to postsecondary education, with funding increases and changes to trades training in BC; costs and impacts of contracting out services in the Ministry of Environment and BC Parks service; improvements in compliance and enforcement programs across government and changes to environmental and natural resource laws that strengthen public oversight; actions to address climate change, including just transition measures for affected workers and communities; changes to improve occupational health and safety for healthcare workers;

promoting the training, recruitment and retention of workers in the justice system, and other changes that may reduce prison violence and improve occupational health and safety in prisons; strategies to address the housing affordability crisis in BC; training, recruitment and retention of childcare and social services workers; services for children, youth and families, ensuring Indigenous families receive an equal level and quality of care, and expanding programs for youth transitioning out of care; and the Labour Code, Workers' Compensation Act, Worksafe BC and employment standards.

- 32. BC Salmon Farmers Association is lobbying several public office holders regarding the BC salmon farming industry, the Environmental Management Act, the Integrated Pest Management Act and the Land Act.
- 33. Boehringer Ingelheim Canada Ltd. is arranging meetings with the Minister of Health (and Ministry staff), and the Parliamentary Secretary for Seniors, to profile the company and identify opportunities to collaborate.
- 34. British Columbia Dental Hygienists' Association is lobbying the Minister of Health with respect to Dental Hygienist 365 Regulation and better access to oral health services for all British Columbians.
- 35. British Columbia Radiological Society is lobbying several public office holders regarding a provincial approach to managing diagnostic imaging.
- 36. British Columbia River Outfitters Association (BCROA) is lobbying staff of the Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture and the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations, and Rural Development regarding promotion of river rafting activities, support for BCROA activities on crown land, and policies to support wilderness tourism.
- 37. Canadian Association of Geophysical Contractors is lobbying the Premier and three Ministers regarding Caribou Habitat Restoration plans.
- 38. Clean Energy Association of British Columbia is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding opportunities in electricity generation and delivery to customers in BC. The focus will be on electrification of transportation, built environment and industry (mining, up-stream natural gas and LNG), as well as aligning electricity generation, development and planning with climate targets.
- 39. Canadian Bankers Association is lobbying a number of public office holders on a range of issues including participating in the review of the Financial Institutions Act and the Credit Union Incorporation Act, encouraging the modification of the Business Practices and Consumer Protection Act to promote protection for consumers, and encouraging the modification of securities legislation to promote a harmonized and competitive securities regime.

- 40. Canadian Red Cross Society is lobbying a number of public office holders on a broad range of topics including emergency management efficiencies, best practices and coordination to ensure timely and consistent emergency services for British Columbians; support to refugee claimants; requests for financial and in kind aid to support domestic and international disasters; recognition of WorkSafe BC First Aid levels; and home support for individuals with health needs.
- 41. Chartered Professional Accountants of British Columbia (CPABC) is lobbying the Minister and Deputy Minister of Finance regarding potential legislative amendments to the Chartered Professional Accountants Act.
- 42. Ecojustice Canada Society is lobbying a number of public office holders to discuss forthcoming climate accountability bill and implementation of Clean BC.
- 43. Explorers and Producers Association of Canada is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding the BC government's reconciliation agenda, Deep Royalty Credit, carbon tax/climate policy, and additional LNG projects.
- 44. Federation of Mountain Clubs of British Columbia is lobbying a number of MLAs regarding issues related to BC Parks and the "right to roam", and to advocate for greater resources for BC Parks and agencies in FLNRORD responsible for back country access.
- 45. GCT Global Container Terminals Inc. is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding ongoing priorities and operational issues related to GCT Vanterm and GCT Deltaport terminals in context of the Western Trade Corridors initiatives and Low Carbon Industrial Strategy.
- 46. General Fusion Inc. is lobbying several public office holders to introduce government officials to General Fusion technology, business strategy and growth plan in BC.
- 47. Heart and Stroke Foundation, BC and Yukon, is lobbying a number of public office holders on various issues including tobacco and vaping control measures; legislation or policies regarding public access to defibrillation; and continuation of the FAST signs of stroke public awareness campaign.
- 48. Hewlett Packard Enterprise Canada Co. is lobbying an extensive list of public agencies regarding HPE servers, networks, storage, software and related support.
- 49. JUUL Labs Canada is arranging meetings with several public office holders to raise awareness and provide communication with key government officials about JUUL Labs Inc. in British Columbia.
- 50. LNG Canada Development Inc. is lobbying several public office holders on a number of topics including discussions on LNG fiscal framework, discussions on LNG-related carbon management issues, and updates on LNG Canada.

- 51. Lyft is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding the regulatory regime for ride-sharing in BC.
- 52. Microsoft Canada Inc. is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding Microsoft platform and services including On-Premise, Hosted and Cloud-based solutions, as well as RFP submissions.
- 53. Ocean Wise Conservation Association is arranging meetings with a number of ministers to discuss policy and funding to support ocean conservation.
- 54. Pasha Brands Holdings Ltd. is lobbying staff of the Agricultural Land Commission and the Ministry of Agriculture with respect to cannabis cultivation on land within the Agricultural Land Reserve.
- 55. Rogers Communications Inc. is lobbying staff of a number of public agencies about contracts and policies related to the delivery of telecommunication services.
- 56. Sandoz Canada Inc. is lobbying a number of public office holders regarding various issues including public funding of pharmaceutical treatments developed, manufactured and supplied by Sandoz Canada; the regulatory environment and utilization rates for generics and biosimilars; regulation of pharmacies in British Columbia to sell and distribute medical cannabis to patients; and digital treatment solutions to treat patients with addictions.
- 57. Suncor Energy Inc. is lobbying a number of public office holders on a number of issues including fuel product supply, climate, market access and spill response, and to promote Suncor's operations in BC.
- 58. Tides Canada Initiatives Society is lobbying a number of public office holders on a range of issues including the BC Endangered Species Act, changes to the Forest & Range Practices Act, and implementation of the new Water Sustainability Act.
- 59. Vancouver Regional Construction Association is arranging meetings with a number of public office holders regarding various issues including taxation policies, procurement practices, public infrastructure projects, the Community Benefits Agreement, and the Terms of Reference for the review of B.C.'s Workers' Compensation system (WorkSafeBC).
- 60. Woodfibre LNG Limited is arranging meetings with a number of ministers on a range of topics including partnerships and reconciliation with First Nations; overseas markets for LNG, aligning education programs with LNG industry needs for a skilled domestic workforce; and taxation and assessment processes at the municipal and regional level.
