

WHO'S LOBBYING WHO IN BC? Monthly Snapshot – March 2025

The following is a brief summary of new Registration Returns activated or re-activated between March 1 and March 31, 2025, under BC's *Lobbyists Transparency Act*.

- tender on a timely and regular basis, particularly given the recent imposition of tariffs on Canada by the United States government.

Amanda van Baarsen, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Community Legal Assistance Society regarding several matters such as changes to the Human Rights Code, expressly adding the ground of "social condition" to the Code, eliminate the definition of "age" in the Code, abolish the exemption for shared accommodations, and allow a representative to advance a human rights complaint in the event a complainant dies, changes to the Mental Health Act, Adult Guardianship Act and associated Regulations in order to stop detentions without authorization or review, remove deemed consent provisions, and enhance fair review hearing for people detained under the Mental Health Act living in British Columbia, changes to the Residential Tenancy Act, Residential Tenancy Regulation, and Residential Tenancy Branch dispute resolution process in order to enhance legal protections for residential tenants living in British Columbia, changes to the Workers Compensation Act and Regulations and WorkSafeBC and Workers Compensation Board policies and processes, oversee the rationalization and simplification of the decision-making process of the Workers Compensation Board, particularly with respect to permanent disability awards, additional funding for retaining lawyers for representation for those who have been involuntarily detained pursuant to the BC Mental Health Act or to those subject to the Mental Disorder Provisions of the Criminal Code of Canada from the Legal Services Society and policy and program recommendations regarding BC government legislation and funding, specifically in the area of reforming the Mental Health Act, establishing an Independent Rights Advice Service for people involuntarily detained under the MHA or the Criminal Code, improved processes at the Residential Tenancy Branch and changes to the Residential Tenancy Act, improved funding of the BC Human Rights Tribunal.
- 35. Amanda van Baarsen, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of High Tide Inc. regarding empowering licensed cannabis retailers to better compete with the illicit market, including on price and consumer access.

- 36. Amanda van Baarsen, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health on behalf of Isologic Innovative Radiopharmaceuticals Ltd. regarding access to Positron Emission Tomography (PET) radiopharmaceuticals.

are the best in Canada and maintain current incentives along with fairness in implementation, regulatory framework for the inclusion of input of Indigenous communities in decision making on prospective and existing mineral exploration activities, inclusive land use planning that relies on scientific data, industry and stakeholder input, minimizing burdens imposed by federal or proposed provincial legislation on Species at Risk and Indigenous perspectives, Policy and program recommendations supporting mineral exploration in British Columbia and legislation and policy that provide clarity regarding resource road access and use.

- 45. Bank of Montreal is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding consumer protection that affect the relationship that banks have with their customers in delivering financial services and the role of banks in the BC economic development with a focus on physical security, economic prosperity, anti-scam strategies and social assistance programs.
- 46. BC Alliance for Healthy Living Society is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding initiatives and infrastructure which can reduce the risk factors that contribute to chronic disease.
- 47. BC Construction Industry Skills Improvement Council is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills regarding funding from Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills.
- 48. BHP Canada Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding status of legacy assets, the support of the development of potash export facility and the support of securing rail access to port.
- 49. British Columbia Chiropractic Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding several matters such as prevention from illicit drug market, health professional regulatory changes, changes to *Workers Compensation Act* to allow concurrent care, integration of BC Chiropractors as part of urgent primary care system, expansion of primary health care teams, increase MSP supplementary payment fee and visits per year, regulation of non-veterinary healthcare, request Chiropractors as a health professional permitted to assess Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction for orthoses and braces, increase ICBC fees to meet fair market value, access to the Provincial eHealth Viewer, CareConnect, for diagnostic imaging reports and images, and laboratory test results and the ability to directly refer patients for X-Ray imaging.

- 50. Canadian Automobile Dealers Association is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions regarding amendments to the Electric Vehicle Mandates, made under the BC Zero-Emission Vehicles Act.
- 51. Canadian Media Producers Association BC Branch is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding improving opportunities for equity seeking producers, insurance solutions and funding for Film and Television sector.
- 52. Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 2278 is lobbying the Parliamentary Secretary for Labour and public office holders at the Ministry of Labour advocating for adequate resources for the Labour Relations Board and inclusion of student workers in the labour code.
- 53. Cranbrook Professional Firefighter Local 1253 is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Labour regarding expanding presumptive cancer coverage, Firefighter Health Screening Programs, and First Responder Resiliency Programs.
- 54. Emergent BioSolutions Canada Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding an increase to public access and funding for NARCAN® (Naloxone HCI) Nasal Spray in BC.
- 55. Enterprise Rent-A-Car Canada Company is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Finance for clarification, modernization and/or changes related to PST bulletin 116, specifically with regard to its application on Canada's vehicle rental/short-term leasing sector.
- 56. EOS Aircraft Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Jobs, Economic Development and Innovation and the Office of the Premier regarding funding for clean tech aerospace programs.
- 57. Esquimalt Fire Fighters Association local 4264 of the International Association of Fire Fighters is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Labour regarding cancer screening for fire fighters, funding mental health programming for fire fighters, and improving Cancer Presumptive Language with WCB for all fire fighters.
- 58. Federation of Independent School Associations in BC is lobbying Member(s) of the Legislative Assembly regarding proportional funding access to the Food in Schools program for needy families with children enrolled in an independent school.
- 59. Fortinet Technologies (Canada) ULC is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding global cybersecurity business, its range of products, its long-term presence in BC, its expansion across Canada and the challenges its Western Canadian operations face in BC.
- 60. Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding fair and equitable access to the provincial forest resource, to increase the

- amount of value-added wood production and long-term solution to the US softwood lumber dispute.
- 61. Invenergy Renewable Services Canada ULC is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding permitting and approvals for clean energy projects and understanding of future government goals within the electricity sector.
- 62. Kamloops Fire Fighters' Association IAFF Local 913 is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding amendments to worksafe legislation to include pre-screening for presumptive cancers as well as enhanced mental health coverage and enhanced presumptive cancer legislation.
- 63. Kelowna Professional Firefighters Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding WorksafeBC Presumptive Cancer for Firefighters, Cancer Screening for Firefighters, and Mental Health Resource funding.
- 64. Kwantlen Faculty Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding Amendments to or establishment of policies, directives, or guidelines governing the financial decisions and accountability of Kwantlen Polytechnic University; amendments to regulations, policies, and legislation governing Boards of Governors of Special Purpose Teaching Universities; development of a communication process of guideline for communications between the Ministry of Advanced Education & Future Skills and post-secondary faculty associations; job protection for faculty association members; and seeking to change the University Act 35.2(2)(g) Senate of a Special Purpose Teaching University.
- 65. New Westminster Firefighters is lobbying public office holders at WorksSafeBC regarding changes in the Workers Compensation Act of British Columbia to amend the Latency periods from 20 years to ten years for testicular and colorectal cancers for firefighters, amending worksafe regulations, funding for cancer screening and mental health supports and initiatives
- 66. Sienna Senior Living Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding funding and funding policy related to the effective provision of quality long-term care in British Columbia as well as recommendations on to growing and maintaining a strong healthcare labour force in the long-term care and seniors living sector.
- 67. Small Change Fund is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding increased provincial spending on climate action and infrastructure, new programs and economic institutions to expedite greenhouse gas reductions, such as new climate-oriented crown corporations, a Youth Climate Corps, more ambitious climate emergency laws, policies and programs, and the public to

- submit written correspondences such as letters to provincial leaders and MLAs urging them to implement a Youth Climate Corps.
- 68. Soprema Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the BC Financial Services Authority regarding mitigation measures under tariff countermeasures.
- 69. Sun Life Financial Inc. is lobbying public office holder at several public agencies regarding privacy and artificial intelligence policy.
- 70. Surfrider Foundation Canada Chapters is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Environment and Parks, Water, Land and Resource Stewardship regarding adding single-use plastic hotel amenities to the BC Single-Use and Plastic Waste Prevention Regulation, policy recommendations on restricting the use of polystyrene foam in floating structures in the aquatic environment, the approval of the District of Tofino's bylaw prohibiting the sale of plastic water bottles 1 Litre and less and the creation of a long-term vision for the Clean Coast Clean Waters shoreline cleanup and derelict vessel removal program.
- 71. Sustaero GP Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding guidelines on environmental permitting and time lines.
- 72. Township of Langley Firefighters Local 4550 is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding health and safety for firefighters, cancer presumption legislation, to increase mental health funding, to repeal single stairway egress legislation, and for pre screening programs to identify cancer in fire fighters.
- 73. Trail Firefighters Local 941 is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly proposing amendments to the Workers Compensation Act, including amendments to include all forms of cancer and lower the employment period to 2 years, mandatory Psychological Safety in the Workplace, and to approve that firefighters across BC have Annual medical screening covered by MSP.
- 74. Varian Medical Systems, Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding awarding and amending contracts for the purchase of medical devices, software and related services and multi-disciplinary oncology partnerships to improve outcomes and drive value across the health system; optimize patient care across the cancer care pathway by pioneering solutions to enhance workflows, improve efficiencies and make treatments more precise.

75. VRIFY Technology Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Jobs, Economic Development and Innovation regarding BC's AI strategy, particularly in the context of critical minerals and collaboration opportunities with the BC government and other stakeholders
