

WHO'S LOBBYING WHO IN BC?

Monthly Snapshot – September 2025

The following is a brief summary of new Registration Returns activated or re-activated between September 1 and September 30, 2025, under BC's *Lobbyists Transparency Act*.

1. Scott Andrews, a consultant lobbyist with Earnscliffe Strategies, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the City of Maple Ridge to seek provincial funding for road improvement projects aimed at improving access to transit, housing, jobs and green space.
2. Jeff Andrus, a consultant lobbyist with Strategies 360 Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Pan-Abode International Ltd. regarding including a Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) as a tool for assessing carbon and energy usage in new homes along with the benefits of value-add wood manufactured structures, and seeking funding and programs for homes and buildings that are low carbon (high carbon sequestering, low material carbon emissions and low operating carbon emissions) and / or meet other Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) criteria.
3. Ashton Arsenault and Jennifer Rossi, consultant lobbyists with Crestview Strategy, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Capital Power Corporation regarding the existing contract for Capital Power's Island Generation facility in Campbell River.
4. Zach Authier, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Enbridge Inc. regarding economic growth and investment attraction and encouraging government action that balances carbon and cost competitiveness, enables growth, jobs and maintains and attracts investment to British Columbia's gas sector and supports the province's economic recovery; Enbridge's current assets in B.C. and potential future

natural gas projects; inquire about and seek to align with government programs that pertain to the natural gas sector, and provincial and federal economic recovery programs; supporting actions that advance reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples and facilitate further relationship- and capacity-building; Supporting climate action policies that advance the world's transition to a low-carbon economy, including influencing implementation of CleanBC in areas of the Clean Industry Fund, industrial electrification, hydrogen and carbon capture, utilization and storage; and supporting policies and actions that ensure BC's regulatory system for natural resource development is timely and effective.

5. Zach Authier, Nicole Brassard and Jill Swenson, consultant lobbyists with Global Public Affairs, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Canadian Steel Producers Association regarding budgets as they relate to infrastructure, including measures associated with economic stimulus spending as well as ongoing infrastructure spending programs; economic and business conditions affecting the steel industry globally as well as in Canada and B.C., including monetary and fiscal policies; and government policies and programs in relation to international steel trade and measures to improve the competitiveness of the domestic steel industry.
6. James Ball, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Infrastructure and Infrastructure BC Inc. on behalf of Canadian Institute of Quantity Surveyors regarding the value of certified and professional estimates provided by Professional Quantity Surveyors and Certified Construction Estimators on provincially procured projects.
7. Amee Barber, a consultant lobbyist with Earncliffe Strategies, is lobbying public office at several public agencies on behalf of Conduent Business Services Canada Inc. regarding policy and program recommendations regarding fare collection and payment systems for public transit as well as support for transit modernization and technical possibilities.
8. Berit Beattie, a consultant lobbyist with CSG Canadian Strategy Group LP, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of HeliCat Canada Association advocating for a streamlined and predictable permitting framework for the helicopter and snowcat skiing industry to ensure long-term sustainable growth, support operational efficiency, and secure timely decision-making for operators in British Columbia's rural tourism sector; advocating for the inclusion of HeliCat Canada as a key stakeholder in discussions about government priorities on export tourism, rural development, and sustainable environmental practices in outdoor adventure tourism; engaging on regulatory efficiency and coordination across ministries to address the

fragmented permitting process that currently involves multiple departments, leading to uncertainty and delays for HeliCat Canada members; and supporting policies that strengthen British Columbia's position as a global leader in adventure tourism by promoting sustainable practices, enhancing economic opportunities in rural communities, and fostering partnerships with Indigenous groups.

9. Lucas Borchenko, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of NorthRiver Midstream Inc. regarding NorthRiver Midstream's infrastructure and the NEBC Connector Project and related regulations and permitting, and regarding climate action policies including the transition to an output-based pricing system.
10. James Cabangon, a consultant lobbyist with Sandstone Group, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Canadian Air Traffic Control Association regarding issues affecting air traffic control and the air transportation sector such as staffing levels, and rules and regulations regarding fatigue and safety, recruitment and retention issues, duration of training and certification.
11. Melissa Carvalho and Beatriz Grigsby-Larson, consultant lobbyists with Global Public Affairs Inc. are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Homewood Health Inc., regarding considerations related to BC's mental health service delivery programs.
12. Cole Cyr, a consultant lobbyist with Colina Consulting Ltd., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of JDS Energy & Mining Inc. regarding the BC governments provincial agreement on Haida Aboriginal Title and the Rising Tide Agreement.
13. Greg D'Avignon, a consultant lobbyist with CSG Canadian Strategy Group LP, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Innovative Medicines Canada advocating for expanding research, investment, and job creation opportunities in British Columbia's life sciences and research and development ecosystem; advocating for innovative procurement of medicines within the health system to improve patient outcomes, including approaches that leverage real-world data to assess effectiveness; to ensure patient access to innovative medicines, support continued research investment, and encourage federal advocacy on the proposed Patented Medicine Prices Review Board regulatory changes; and to ensure recognition of the value of Innovative Medicines in improving patient outcomes, enhancing system efficiency, and fostering economic growth through sustained investment in the drug plan.

14. Greg D'Avignon, a consultant lobbyist with CSG Canadian Strategy Group LP, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Kerkhoff Construction LTD. regarding support for the 580 Commonage housing project in Vernon, a 1,040-acre development that will deliver up to 4,000 cost-efficient homes, preserve 650 acres of parkland, and enable millions in infrastructure upgrades benefiting the project and the City of Vernon.
15. Michael Gardiner, a consultant lobbyist with Strategies 360 Canada, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Jobs and Economic Growth and the Ministry of Tourism, Arts, Culture and Sport on behalf of Star 333 Sports Inc. regarding supporting and promoting the sport of cricket in BC, and in particular the Canada Super 60's Cricket Tournament, through financial and in-kind support.
16. Patrick Giesbrecht, a consultant lobbyist with Giesbrecht and Company, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation and the Ministry of Water, Land and Resource Stewardship on behalf of Sq'ewlets First Nation regarding the proposed dredging of Harrison Bay, including environmental assessment, regulatory approvals, operational requirements, and engagement with the Ministry of Environment to facilitate project planning, permitting, and compliance with applicable provincial environmental policies; and regarding the strength of claim and jurisdictional rights of Sq'ewlets First Nation over unceded lands within their traditional territory, including recognition of the Nation's authority in land use planning and development decisions, consultation and engagement obligations of provincial and local government agencies, and alignment of provincial policies and decisions with First Nation rights and title claims.
17. Steve Greenaway, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of CareRx Corporation regarding developing a commercial partner relationship and a sustainable funding model for long-term care Plan B Pharmacare services across British Columbia.
18. Trevor Kramer and Richard Ositashvili, consultant lobbyists with StrategyCorp Inc., are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of CARFAX Canada ULC regarding auto theft and the *Motor Dealer Act*, and privacy considerations around the use of Vehicle Identification Numbers and Carfax offerings to law enforcement.
19. Sajjid Lakhani, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Western Dairy Council seeking provincial support for a Grocery

Industry Code of Practice to advance national implementation, seeking provincial support for increasing and upgrading dairy processing capacity in British Columbia, seeking government support to ensure provincial policies enable and encourage investment in dairy processing in BC, and seeking continued provincial support for a Grocery Industry Code of Practice to advance national implementation following update on recent developments at the national level.

20. Jean-Michel Laurin, a consultant lobbyist with TACTIX Government Relations & Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions and the Office of the Premier on behalf of Honda Canada Inc. regarding zero-emission vehicles (ZEV), including the *Zero-Emission Vehicles Act*.
21. Marisa Maslink, a consultant lobbyist with McMillan Vantage, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Aeon Group Inc. regarding the development and execution of public infrastructure initiatives.
22. James Mitchell, a consultant lobbyist with Santis Health Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Coloplast Canada Corporation regarding access to and coverage of medical devices (including catheters) and other related health care services.
23. John Moonen, a consultant lobbyist with John Moonen & Associates Ltd., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Montrose Industries Ltd. attempting to convince government to respond to the 2025 BC Supreme Court Decision Cowichan Tribes v. Canada in such a way that protects the company from any resulting losses, costs or other negative impacts.
24. Junghyun Park, a consultant lobbyist with T.B.T. Consulting Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of KO-CA Foundation for Culture Exchange Association regarding support for multicultural and cultural programs, strengthening economic and SME cooperation between British Columbia and Korea, including creative industries, trade in cultural products, and bilateral partnerships that contribute to sustainable development.
25. Jean-Marc Prevost, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of GlaxoSmithKline Inc. regarding the Patented Medicines Pricing Review Board and its potential impact on BC's Life Sciences and Research Community; pharmaceutical and health sciences research; pharmaceutical and vaccine procurement, drug and vaccine listings on publicly funded programs and other issues related to access to GSK medicines; advancement of GSK medicines and vaccines with stakeholders of the healthcare system; access to GSK Medicines and Vaccines, clinical trials and advancement of the

life sciences industry; pharmaceutical and health policy, economic development as it relates to clinical trials and other research, scientific information related to GSK's portfolio of medicines and vaccines; and opportunities for collaboration re: Green BC.

26. Lukas Redmond, a consultant lobbyist with StrategyCorp Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Tudor Gold Corp. regarding the preservation of Tudor Gold Corp.'s mineral tenures at the Treaty Creek Goldstorm Deposit.
27. Raj Sihota, a consultant lobbyist with Strategies 360 Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Pan-Abode International Ltd. seeking funding and programs for homes and buildings that are low carbon (high carbon sequestering, low material carbon emissions and low operating carbon emissions) and / or meet other Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) criteria; regarding procurement policies and opportunities to support BC/Canadian wood products and manufacturers in park infrastructure projects; and regarding senior public office holders awareness of the benefits of including a Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) as a tool for assessing carbon and energy usage in new homes along with the benefits of value-add wood manufactured structures.
28. Matthew Wigmore, a consultant lobbyist with Framepoint Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Dynacare regarding Dynacare's current business within the province and opportunities for growth in the lab sector.
29. 1378953 B.C. LTD is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding defence technology modernization, policy for digital and quantum transformation pilots in healthcare, public-sector IT procurement standards and vendor evaluation and standards for cybersecurity, data residency and patient privacy in health IT.
30. Anglo American plc is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding economic development; British Columbia government support for Anglo American plc and Teck Resources merger.
31. Azure Sustainable Fuels Corp. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding a domestic sustainable aviation fuel market.
32. Bolt Services CA Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding advocacy, development and assessment of any legislative proposals impacting Transportation Network Service companies, including matters related to transportation and labour law. Advocacy regarding changes to shared transport policy (electric bikes and electric scooters) and autonomous vehicles.

33. Canadian Association of Physicians for the Environment is lobbying public office holders at the Ministries of Energy and Climate Solutions and Housing and Municipal Affairs regarding changes to energy policy.
34. Fero International Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding opportunities to use modular construction to enhance infrastructure in the healthcare, education and housing sectors.
35. Fujifilm Sonosite Canada Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding medical imaging solutions involving Fujifilm Sonosite devices and services, and regarding policies to support the effective selection of medical imaging solutions which promote patient access, quality health care outcomes and cost efficiency.
36. IKEA Canada Limited Partnership is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding the creation of incentives for green entrepreneurs to grow the circular economy. Building a provincial circular economy framework that provides easily accessible reuse, repair and recycling options for residents.
37. Lookout Housing and Health Society is lobbying public office holders at British Columbia Housing Management Commission and Community Living British Columbia regarding low barrier support and administrative fee expenditures.
38. Marine Renewables Canada Society is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding policy and program recommendations on expanding the use of renewable energy in rural and remote communities and the government and BC Hydro's approach to growing BC's supply of renewable energy.
39. Mining Suppliers Association of B.C. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies advocating to improve the timeliness, predictability and certainty of mine permitting and authorizations.

Modular Building Institute is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding the adoption of modular construction in various sectors, including affordable housing, education, and healthcare, regulations impacting modular construction, including building codes and standards, and the application of PST to modular buildings in the province.

Pan-Abode International Ltd. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding access to timber and fibre sales via provincial sales for high value-add wood manufacturers; the benefits of including a Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) as a tool for assessing carbon and energy usage in new homes along with the benefits of value-add wood manufactured structures; procurement policies and opportunities to support BC/Canadian wood products and manufacturers in park infrastructure projects; and seeking funding and programs for homes and buildings that are low carbon (high carbon sequestering, low material carbon emissions and low operating carbon emissions) and / or meet other Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) criteria.

Sunrise Family Services Society is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly and public office holders at the Ministry of Children and Family Development regarding the Province's current adoption review and the role of licensed adoption agencies in BC, and seeking support for the licensed adoption agencies in BC seeking to provide input on any new government framework for the delivery of adoption services in the province, for domestic or intercountry adoptions.
44. Taurus Canada Renewable Natural Gas Corporation is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly and public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions regarding developing projects related to renewable natural gas from Agriculture or other biowaste byproducts in alignment with the Province's energy needs.
