

WHO'S LOBBYING WHO IN BC?

Monthly Snapshot – February 2026

The following is a brief summary of new Registration Returns activated or re-activated between February 1 and February 28, 2026, under BC's *Lobbyists Transparency Act*.

1. Zach Authier and Leila Farmer, consultant lobbyists with Global Public Affairs Inc., are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Deh Tai LP to advance the Tu Deh-Kah Geothermal Project by clearly articulating its strategic value to the Province and the North, and by seeking timely financial and policy support to support the project's successful implementation.
2. James Cabangon, a consultant lobbyist with Sandstone Group, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Ch'íyáqtel First Nations seeking government support for both on-reserve and off-reserve economic development projects.
3. Michele Cadario and Samira Levesque, consultant lobbyists with Rubicon Strategy Inc., are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the Carpenters' Regional Council to discuss training and to seek approval of the Carpenters' Regional Council as a Designated Training Provider for certain trades, to hold discussions with the Minister of Labour and the Minister's office regarding the benefits of unionization, and to engage with the Government of British Columbia on issues of importance to the union, including union based training, childcare for individuals in the trades, and increasing the participation of Canadians in the trades.
4. Jeffrey Ferrier, a consultant lobbyist with Framepoint Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Tlingit Homeland Energy Limited Partnership to secure BC

Government support for federal funding of the Atlin Hydroelectricity Expansion Project and fair regulatory treatment of the Atlin Hydroelectricity Expansion Project.

5. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Enserva regarding a formal partnership with WorkSafeBC to resolve regional enforcement and interpretation inconsistencies in Northeast B.C., with the desired outcome of consistent regulatory application across British Columbia, improved compliance clarity, and a more predictable, collaborative enforcement environment for industry; harmonize provincial health and safety regulations; and regulatory improvements related to labour practices and oversight on industrial and energy project work sites.
6. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Gateway Casinos & Entertainment Limited regarding the challenges facing the gaming industry in British Columbia, including its long term sustainability and growth, as well as to provide updates on current property developments, future development plans, and the company's economic contributions to municipalities and the province, which may include requests for assistance with the issuance of permits and regulatory approvals.
7. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of TransCanada PipeLines Limited regarding the operations of the NGTL system including construction of new project expansions to the system; Aboriginal consultation and negotiations for the Coastal GasLink Pipeline and NGTL System; BC Energy Regulator implementation of methane regulations; Indigenous access to capital for energy infrastructure projects in B.C.; regulatory approvals for the Coastal GasLink Project; the regulatory and environmental assessment process for the NGTL System and the Coastal GasLink Project; gas pipeline activities, LNG infrastructure and gas supply development; the planning, execution, operations and regulatory approvals to the Coastal GasLink Pipeline and NGTL System; and construction and long-term operation of Coastal GasLink Pipelines and other natural gas pipelines from the northeast gas producing regions.
8. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Uber Canada Inc. regarding policy proposal related to labour standards for app-based workers in Canada, and policy and program recommendations regarding the growth of ridesharing and delivery in BC, including the company's commitment to become zero-emissions platform by 2040.

9. Taylor Kyte, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly and the Minister of State for Artificial Intelligence and New Technologies on behalf of Ethos Lab Educational Society regarding engagement on artificial intelligence policy and innovation adoption, including government strategies, funding programs, and partnerships that support AI skills development, digital literacy, and workforce readiness initiatives. Discussions may relate to provincial efforts to advance AI integration across sectors, strengthen talent pipelines, and support community based innovation infrastructure aligned with emerging technology priorities.
10. Taylor Kyte, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Canadian Steel Producers Association regarding government policies and programs in relation to international steel trade and measures to improve the competitiveness of the domestic steel industry; economic and business conditions affecting the steel industry globally as well as in Canada and B.C., including monetary and fiscal policies; and budgets as they relate to infrastructure, including measures associated with economic stimulus spending as well as ongoing infrastructure spending programs.
11. Sajjid Lakhani, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of British Columbia Radiological Society regarding investing additional funding annually to increase after-hours imaging premiums, stabilizing on-call coverage to protect patient access to medical imaging, reduce wait times, and ensure equitable care across British Columbia.
12. Michael McDonald, a consultant lobbyist with Kirk & Co. Consulting Ltd., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Forum Asset Management Inc. regarding Forum Asset Management Inc's student housing portfolio and current activity with universities within various municipalities in the province and discussing the need for student housing within the province; the development of coherent policy around the approvals and fees associated with developing purpose-built student housing as a private developer and operator - including guidance to municipalities on Development Cost Charges (DCCs), Community Amenity Contributions (CACs) and permitting fees; standardized criteria for waivers/reductions for qualifying projects, and alignment with BC Housing/BC Builds program requirements.
13. Allie Meeres, a consultant lobbyist with Sedgwick Strategies Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Imperial Metals Corporation regarding policy and program recommendations related to mineral exploration activities and regulatory processes in British

Columbia, specifically with respect to permitting, environmental guidelines, and operational requirements for mining projects.

14. Shannon Phillips, a consultant lobbyist with Meredith Boessenkool & Phillips MBPolicy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Thesis Gold Inc. regarding Lawyers-Ranch gold-silver project, including permitting, access to transmission, and ensuring government awareness of indigenous partnerships in the project.
15. Jean-Marc Prevost, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Oceanic Wind Energy Inc regarding regulatory and policy framework that supports offshore wind as a key priority in BC's energy mix. Ensuring the project's objectives are integrated into key policy discussions on renewable energy expansion, reconciliation, and CleanBC review and implementation, with the unique aspects of offshore wind development, particularly the project scale of approx. 600 MW.
16. Rosalind Robertson, a consultant lobbyist with Earncliffe Strategies, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Health on behalf of Insulet Canada Corporation to inform elected officials and senior decision makers about the Omnipod 5 insulin pump technology for the treatment of diabetes, and to promote market access for new and emerging medical devices and technologies, including within pharmacare frameworks.
17. Samira Wagner, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holder at several public agencies on behalf of Prince Rupert Port Authority regarding funding opportunities to support port operation and infrastructure expansion, as well as sustainable growth initiatives, including decarbonization and corridor community initiatives.
18. Leah Ward and Grace Wainaina, consultant lobbyists with Wellington Advocacy Inc., are lobbying public office holders at the British Columbia Securities Commission and the Ministry of Finance on behalf of the Canadian ETF Association (CETFA) to promote the organization and its priorities with elected officials, public servants, and political staff involved in, or interested in, legislation and policy affecting financial institutions, investments, and pensions. This advocacy focuses on advancing priorities to strengthen Canada's investment landscape, restrict distribution incentives for non-Canadian ETFs, and establish tax-advantaged accounts to encourage investment in fixed income ETFs.
19. Richard Zussman, a consultant lobbyist with Burson (Hill&Knowlton), is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health on behalf of Dexcom Canada Co. regarding the expansion of glucose monitoring devices for people in British Columbia living with diabetes, as well as the province's

PharmaCare funding as committed to those living with diabetes. This also includes meeting with the province about CGM expansion to serve more people in British Columbia living with diabetes, and discussing the implementation of BC PharmaCare and the stated goals of addressing diabetes.

20. Richard Zussman, a consultant lobbyist with Burson (Hill&Knowlton), is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health and the Provincial Health Services Authority on behalf of Seqirus Canada Inc., to discuss the ongoing flu season, including its market-leading Flucelvax product, and to engage with the Province on its vaccination strategy and the success of senior influenza immunization efforts in British Columbia.
21. Arbios Biotech Canada Limited Partnership is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies advocating for the establishment of sustainable funding mechanisms to support the development, scaling, and long-term success of the biofuels industry in British Columbia, including seeking funding and continued support for the biofuels industry, specifically for the organization, with a focus on innovative technologies that reduce forestry waste and advance renewable energy goals; for regulatory measures and economic incentives to safeguard the biofuels industry in British Columbia, ensuring its competitiveness and resilience amidst evolving environmental and economic policies; and for policy initiatives, funding opportunities, and program development aimed at promoting the growth and adoption of biofuels in British Columbia, contributing to the province's climate action and energy transition objectives.
22. Association of Canadian Travel Agencies is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding interprovincial regulatory harmonization relating to travel agency licensing and travel insurance distribution. ACTA is encouraging consideration of changes that would: Establish mutual recognition of equivalent provincial travel agency licensing regimes; Reduce duplicative licensing, reporting, and compliance requirements for agencies operating interprovincially; Facilitate the ability of licensed agencies and host agencies to support travel advisors located in multiple provinces; Enable licensed travel advisors to distribute travel insurance products to clients across provincial boundaries based on home-province credentials. The broader context relates to reducing interprovincial barriers to trade while maintaining consumer protection standards through coordinated regulatory oversight and information sharing between jurisdictions.
23. BC Marine Terminal Operators Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding advocacy for changes to road and highway infrastructure impacting freight movement, and the inclusion of impacts on freight in decision-making; finance, economy, sustainability,

transportation, and infrastructure; economic outcomes and recommendations; policy and program recommendations regarding fiscal and economic policy, transportation, infrastructure, sustainability, and reconciliation; policy implications of taxation; policy implications of climate action; policy recommendations regarding economic stimulus; policy recommendations regarding government economic stimulus, infrastructure, and supply chain challenge response in the areas of transportation, climate change, infrastructure, taxation, and competitiveness; and policy recommendations regarding infrastructure.

24. British Columbia Radiological Society is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding increasing and maintaining access to medical (diagnostic) imaging for patients through additional capital equipment; increased, sustainable funding for medical (diagnostic) imaging in BC; increasing health human resource capacities; increasing use of non-hospital medical (diagnostic) imaging services; maintaining current governance and compensation models for radiologists; and quality of care for patients.
25. British Columbia's Children's Hospital Foundation is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly to seek funding for the development of a new mental health building on the BC Children's Hospital campus.
26. Canadian Association of Retired Persons is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding provincial healthcare policy, funding, and program reforms affecting older adults in British Columbia, specifically promoting increased investments in home care and adoption of a home first model of care to reduce unnecessary emergency room visits and acute care hospital admissions among seniors, recommending expanded provincial programs and incentives supporting fall prevention strategies including tax measures, grants, and funding for safe and accessible home modifications designed to reduce injuries, hospitalizations, surgeries, rehabilitation demands, and mortality associated with falls, advocating for enhanced public funding and universal access to preventative vaccination programs for seniors consistent with Health Canada and NACI recommendations including vaccines related to influenza, RSV, shingles, pneumococcal disease, and COVID 19, supporting policies that expand the supply, recruitment, and retention of healthcare professionals including personal support workers, family physicians, geriatric specialists, and surgical capacity relevant to aging populations with the objective of improving care access, reducing wait times, and improving patient outcomes, and encouraging modernization of long term care models

including transitioning from task based care delivery toward individualized, person centred care and strengthening behavioural and complex care supports for residents.

27. DIVERSEcity Community Resources Society is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health regarding continued funding and a full and timely renewal of the Community Action Initiative Community Counselling Fund, which is supported by the BC Ministry of Health, to ensure organizations like DIVERSEcity can continue offering services without disruption. In previous years, delayed confirmation of annual renewals has resulted in staff layoffs, service interruptions, and organizational instability, and stable, multi year funding would allow community agencies to plan for long term service delivery, retain experienced staff, and respond strategically to community needs rather than navigating year to year uncertainty.
28. Elemental Clean Fuels (Canada), Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies advocating for the provincial government to support ECF's federal requests for grant funding for First Nation partner, TTeS, and contacts for potential federal customers for bunkered fuel.
29. InkWell Solutions Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Citizens' Services regarding exploring opportunities to support the Province with connected digital service delivery.
30. Kootenay Lake Teachers' Association is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly and the Minister of State for Local Governments and Rural Communities regarding the Provincial Bargaining Table, designations and student support, and funding and classroom overcrowding.
31. New Westminster & District Labour Council is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding HandyDart accessible transit service delivery in Metro Vancouver and concerns regarding transit funding and a request to increase funding for the operations of the transit system.
32. Petrolia Nasional Berhad (PETRONAS) is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions and the Office of the Premier regarding the competitiveness of British Columbia's regulatory and policy landscape. The purpose of these discussions is to better understand the government's policy objectives and to support the development of clear, predictable, and efficient policy frameworks that enable responsible and feasible development in British Columbia.
33. Revelstoke Teachers' Association is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding the number of qualified and experienced teachers who wish to return to the classroom after maternity/parental leave, but are unable to do so due to the limited availability of child care.
34. Saanich Teachers' Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding Alberta Teachers Bargaining, concerns about invoking not withstanding clause, and implications for

provincial bargaining and Labour Code; and BCTF provincial bargaining, public education, K-12 teachers, chronic underfunding, classroom workload and conditions, benefits, specialist teachers.
