

WHO'S LOBBYING WHO IN BC?

Monthly Snapshot – March 2026

The following is a brief summary of new Registration Returns activated or re-activated between March 1 and March 31, 2026, under BC's *Lobbyists Transparency Act*.

Ashton Arsenault and James Cabangon, consultant lobbyists with Crestview Strategy, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Rothmans, Benson & Hedges Inc. regarding any new environmental and recycling regulations which may concern cigarettes, vaping pods or devices, and other single use plastics; and any new legislative or regulatory proposals or policies relating to tobacco and or vaping, including product regulation and packaging and labeling requirements, taxation, and tobacco harm reduction.
2. Justin Bérubé , a consultant lobbyist with Falkirk Consulting, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Flutter Entertainment plc regarding regulating private online gambling, including addressing the unregulated grey market in igaming, information on legal private frameworks in other jurisdictions in Canada and economic impacts for taxation if the province were to regulate private online gambling.
3. James Cabangon , a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of McDonald's Restaurants of Canada regarding its labour and skills training strategy, investments in Canadian agriculture commodities, and seeking to share corporate stewardship undertakings with government.
4. David Campbell, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Canadian Union of Skilled Workers-British

Columbia, CUSW-BC regarding policy and program recommendations regarding expanding the province's pool of available skilled tradespeople, particularly for major projects.

5. Michael Cunningham, a consultant lobbyist with Graphite Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Association of Book Publishers of British Columbia regarding increased funding to the BC Arts Council and Creative BC to support BC book publishers through their respective programs; programs that support Reconciliation with Indigenous peoples through writing, publishing, and education; for the Ministries of Education to enter into a print and digital licence with Access Copyright to ensure creators are fairly compensated for the use of their material in classrooms; for government support of the BC book publishing industry through tax credits, marketing support, and other initiatives; to incentivize the purchase of BC-published books for K-12 schools and mandate their inclusion in the BC curriculum; and to support the purchase of BC-published content by public libraries.
6. Nicholas Gall, a consultant lobbyist with PAA Advisory | Conseils, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Jobs and Economic Growth and the Office of the Premier on behalf of Moment Energy Inc., seeking financial and political support from the Government of British Columbia, to support Moment Energy's future growth and investment in the province.
7. Steve Greenaway, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Surety Association of Canada to be a part of consultations to ensure that surety bonds are at the forefront of discussions and that any amendments to existing legislation will include the establishment of mandatory bonding on all public work.
8. Robin Guy, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Prince Rupert Port Authority regarding identifying potential funding opportunities to support port operation and infrastructure expansion, as well as sustainable growth initiatives, including decarbonization and corridor community initiatives.
9. Laryssa Waler Hetmanczuk, a consultant lobbyist with Henley Strategies, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Housing and Municipal Affairs and the Office of the Premier on behalf of High Art Capital Inc. regarding discussions with government officials on the viability and potential establishment of a fund in British Columbia that would mirror the High Art GTA Rental and Affordable Housing Initiative, developed in partnership with the Building Ontario Fund, with the aim of acquiring

blocks of newly completed but unsold condominium units across the Greater Toronto Area and converting them into long-term rental housing.

10. Nicola Hill, a consultant lobbyist with Hilltop Public Affairs Corp., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of WELL Health Technologies Corp. regarding an existing contract for its e-referral technology with the Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA).
11. Nicola Hill, a consultant lobbyist with Hilltop Public Affairs Corp., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of MakeWay Charitable Society to advocate for new funding partnership opportunities and additional funding mechanisms to increase investments in the Watershed Security Fund to support First Nations, local governments, and communities in planning, managing, and restoring their local watersheds.
12. Nicola Hill, a consultant lobbyist with Hilltop Public Affairs Corp., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of North Island-Coast Development Initiative Trust regarding a proposal for a strategic investment in the Trust, and to engage regional leadership in a dialogue on a model that reflects regional equity for First Nations, local governments, rural and remote communities, and the population base the Trust serves.
13. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Canadian Life and Health Insurance Association Inc. regarding changes to the Personal Information Protection Act (PIPA); balanced approach to national pharmacare; inclusion of private payers in pan-Canadian Pharmaceutical Alliance; market conduct issues of relevance to the life and health insurance industry; and issues of relevance to the life and health insurance industry.
14. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Diabetes Canada regarding the Framework for Diabetes in Canada, including convening senior public servants and stakeholders over three years beginning in 2023 as mandated by the Public Health Agency of Canada, and recommending that the government of British Columbia exempt students living with diabetes from provincial policies restricting cellphone access in schools, commit to long term investment in the BC Type 2 Diabetes Network as the province's comprehensive diabetes strategy aligned with the Framework for Diabetes in Canada, enhance access to diabetes medications, devices and supplies and supports for British Columbians living with diabetes, expand patient choice of medications, devices and supplies in recognition that diabetes management cannot follow a one size fits all approach, and reduce

administrative and other barriers so British Columbians living with diabetes can readily access the medications, devices and supplies they need.

15. Leah Holoiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Global University Systems Canada Inc. regarding international student recruitment and trusted institution framework policy.
16. Leah Holoiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Labatt Breweries of Canada regarding BC markup policy as it pertains to taxation measures implemented by the BC Government; changes to delivery model of Ready-to-Drink (RTD) products in BC; and the merits of amending policies regarding the manufacturing and distribution of alcoholic beverages in British Columbia.
17. Leah Holoiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Shoppers Drug Mart Inc regarding application of technologies developed by QHR Technologies, a subsidiary of Shoppers Drug Mart; assisting the Province in providing and expanding Mental Health and Addiction Assistance through the chain of pharmacies and technologies developed by the client; and expanding the scope of prescriptions that may be filled directly by Pharmacists.
18. Gerry Jeffcott, a consultant lobbyist with 3Sixty Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health and the Office of the Premier on behalf of The Canadian Forum for Rare Disease Innovators (RAREi) for the provincial expensive drugs for rare disease program review and other rare disease related policy issues.
19. Mark Jiles, consultant lobbyist with Bluestone Government Relations, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills on behalf of Strava College regarding the expansion of the number and variety of programs it offers and seeking approval for degree-granting status.
20. Madison Kuchar, a consultant lobbyist with McMillan Vantage, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Aecon Group Inc. to ensure that current and updated information related to the development and execution of public infrastructure initiatives is effectively communicated.
21. Emma Macklem, a consultant lobbyist with Framepoint Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Rhodes Wellness College Ltd. regarding the recognition of the value that well-established regulated career colleges can bring to government in the areas of mental

health, addictions, and other services that may be supported through counselling, particularly institutions such as Rhodes Wellness College Ltd., which has decades of experience working successfully with marginalized populations.

22. Joshua Matthewman, Don Moors, and Harshivam Bawa, consultant lobbyists with Temple Scott Associates Inc., are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Pano AI, Inc. to raise awareness of Pano AI's wildfire detection technology and explore potential government partnerships, pilot projects, procurement opportunities, and funding programs related to wildfire prevention, detection, and response.
23. Ashley McDougall, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of British Columbia Association of Speech Language Pathologists and Audiologists regarding program recommendations to support communication health as it relates to education, health, children, and seniors.
24. Michael McKinnon, a consultant lobbyist with Enterprise Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Canadian Propane Association regarding further use of propane as a low emission fuel, propane related policies and regulations and changes to energy or environmental policies relating to the propane sector.
25. Michael McKinnon, a consultant lobbyist with Enterprise Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Google Canada Corporation, communicating about artificial intelligence (AI), including the regulation of AI, government investment in AI, and the promotion of AI training and skills development, as well as online safety policy and the BC Online Safety Action Table.
26. Robert Mingay, a consultant lobbyist with Bluestone Government Relations, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Sunrise Poultry Processors Ltd. to seek government engagement on the relocation of Sunrise Poultry's production facility and to advocate for a level playing field through the provincial task force on interprovincial trade barriers, with the aim of enhancing British Columbia's food security.
27. Matthew Mitschke, a consultant lobbyist with Barrack Hill Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Moderna Biopharma Canada Corporation, communicating with government about pharmaceutical and biotechnology policies, including those related to innovation, R&D, and messenger ribonucleic acid (mRNA) biotechnology, as well as communicating with government regarding policies around RSV vaccines for British Columbians.

28. Rob Nagai, consultant lobbyist with Bluestone Government Relations, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Strava College regarding the expansion of the number and variety of programs it offers and seeking approval for degree-granting status.
29. Naresh Raghubeer, a consultant lobbyist with Sandstone Group, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Cermaq Canada Ltd. regarding promoting the benefits of Cermaq's salmon farming investments in Canada and seeking a positive path forward for continued investments, job creation, food security, exports, and economic reconciliation with First Nations.
30. Christine Rzepa, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Canadian News Media Association regarding Canada's news publishers and local journalism.
31. Raj Sihota, a consultant lobbyist with Strategies 360 Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Adler University regarding changes to Provincial Attestation Letter.
32. Kimberly Sterling and Stanley Shtilman, consultant lobbyists with StrategyCorp Inc., are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the Society for the Promotion of Manual Practice Osteopathy (DBA OsteopathyBC) to engage government stakeholders and build awareness of the osteopathic profession and its interest in regulation.
33. Mandeep Sharma, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Labour and the Office of the Premier on behalf of Cobalt Safety Consulting Inc. regarding the harmonization of safety standards across the country.
34. Katie Shaw and Justin Bérubé, consultant lobbyists with Falkirk Consulting, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Elemental Clean Fuels (Canada) Inc. to discuss policy, programs, and grants with the Government of British Columbia that support the emerging clean fuel economy, with multiple projects currently underway across Canada.
35. Katie Shaw and Justin Bérubé, consultant lobbyists with Falkirk Consulting, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Coeur Silvertip Holdings Ltd. to discuss the potential expansion and restart of the Silvertip mine.
36. Dev Singh, a consultant lobbyist with Sandstone Group, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Thales Canada Inc. regarding discussion about policies in relation to defence industrialization in Canada, and discussions about Canadian defence industrial capabilities regarding shipbuilding and acquisition of new capabilities by DND and the Canadian Coast Guard for

in-service support, continuous capability sustainment, C4ISR and networking programs, ground vehicles, optronics, military avionics and related equipment, identity and access management solutions, and cybersecurity and AI solutions and technologies.

37. Ruth Thorkelson, a consultant lobbyist with Tactix Government Relations & Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Honda Canada, communicating with government officials about auto safety recall completion rates; CleanBC's "Roadmap to 2030"; electric and hybrid vehicle battery management, including measures to regulate and recycle batteries; the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change's "Extended Producer Responsibility Five-Year Action Plan 2021–2026"; and zero emission vehicles (ZEV), including the Zero-Emission Vehicles Act.
38. Bill Tieleman, a consultant lobbyist with West Star Communications, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of The Professional Hockey Players' Association regarding obtaining WorkSafeBC workers compensation coverage for PHPA members in BC; promoting health and safety.
39. Nolan Toscano and Abbey Martynes, consultant lobbyists with Sandstone Group, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Ch'iyáqtel First Nations seeking government support for both on-reserve and off-reserve economic development projects.
40. Marco Violo, a consultant lobbyist with StrategyCorp Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Tudor Gold Corp. regarding the preservation of Tudor Gold Corp.'s mineral tenures at the Treaty Creek Goldstorm Deposit.
41. Steve Vander Wal, a consultant lobbyist with Rocky Point Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health and the Office of the Premier on behalf of Gastrointestinal Society regarding streamlining care pathways for people living with inflammatory bowel disease (IBD) to reduce delays in diagnosis and treatment and improve patient outcomes.
42. Steve Vander Wal, a consultant lobbyist with Rocky Point Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health and the Office of the Premier on behalf of The Canadian Forum for Rare Disease Innovators (RAREi) for the provincial expensive drugs for rare disease program review and other rare disease related policy issues.
43. Richard Zussman, a consultant lobbyist with Burson (Hill&Knowlton), is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Education and Child Care and the Ministry of Health on behalf of ALK-Abello Pharmaceuticals Inc. regarding stocking ALK products in schools and other environments where there

may be a likelihood of people with allergies, and stocking ALK products, including Neffy, in BC schools and other public spaces.

44. Adler University is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding post-secondary education policy and regulation.
45. ASPECT Association of Service Providers for Employability and Career Training is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies to advocate for changes to the new WorkBC procurement model and related program development, and to seek funding for workforce development training or workforce development research.
46. Better Way Alliance is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies, advocating for the development of a commercial rent stabilization framework to protect small businesses in British Columbia, including recommendations to modernize the Commercial Tenancy Act or introduce new legislation to support commercial lease fairness and dispute resolution mechanisms, as well as engagement on economic development strategies focused on small business retention, local economic resilience, and policies to mitigate rising operational costs for commercial tenants.
47. Bridal Veil Mountain Resort LTD. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies in support of an Indigenous-led, multi-use commercial, industrial, and residential development project, which may include boundary changes, FN loan guarantees, and a request for partnership with BC Housing.
48. Canadian Charging Infrastructure Council is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding policies, regulations, legislation, and funding related to zero-emission vehicles (ZEVs) and ZEV charging infrastructure.
49. Calian Group Ltd. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Jobs and Economic Growth regarding the delivery of ground-based space systems within the territory of the Province of British Columbia.
50. Canadian ETF Association (CETFA) is lobbying public office holders at the British Columbia Securities Commission regarding policy and program recommendations, specifically the elimination or modernization of the BCSC ETF fee structure to reduce structural cost burdens on Canadian-listed ETFs and enhance domestic market competitiveness.
51. Canadian Home Builders' Association Central Interior is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Housing and Municipal Affairs regarding streamlining housing approvals, low carbon solutions, and reducing the costs of new homes, including further improvements to provincial regulations,

expanded funded for CleanBC incentives to energy retrofits, and reforms to development finance tools. Initiatives underway to address workforce labour challenges were also discussed.

52. The Canadian Home Builders' Association - Vancouver Island is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Housing and Municipal Affairs to address the cost of building homes through improvements to development finance tools such as DCCs, CACs, and PST, while also advancing priorities discussed during CHBA BC's Day at the Legislature, including streamlining housing approvals, supporting low-carbon solutions, expanding CleanBC retrofit incentives, and reforming provincial regulations. The Association further advocates for greater reliance on qualified professionals to accelerate approvals, improvements to permitting strategies for housing, and streamlined permitting processes across Forestry, Transportation, and Environment, including under the Water Act, Riparian Regulations, and archaeological permitting.
53. Canadian Scholarship Trust Foundation is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies to seek amendments to British Columbia's property exemption framework, potentially including the Court Order Enforcement Act, to designate Registered Education Savings Plans (RESPs) as exempt property in bankruptcy and court order enforcement proceedings.
54. Carfax Canada is lobbying public office holders at the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia regarding determining if fraudulent vin identification is of value for the BC vehicle registration database; determining if additional private sector products would be of value to help mitigate risk with ICBC; and amending existing commercial arrangement for vehicle history data to increase monetary value and utility.
55. Colwood Fire Fighters' Association IAFF Local 5420 is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding Burn Fund care recovery resources, seeking to move from an explicitly charity based recovery resource system to a provincially funded model.
56. Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption – Canada is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Children and Family Development regarding policy and program recommendations regarding the government's response to permanency for children in foster care.
57. Delta Teachers' Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding teaching conditions in the public school system and regarding COVID-19 related issues for students, educators, support staff and families, and is advocating for funding for public education in the district and the province of British Columbia and for student learning conditions in public education.

58. Global X Investments Canada Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the British Columbia Securities Commission regarding policy and program recommendations, specifically the elimination or modernization of the BCSC ETF fee structure to reduce structural cost burdens on Canadian-listed ETFs and enhance domestic market competitiveness.
59. International Association of Heat and Frost Insulators and Allied Workers Local 118 is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding encouraging the provincial government to license asbestos removal and consulting firms; strengthening asbestos health and safety laws, rules, and regulations; promoting the use of appropriate mechanical insulation in buildings to conserve energy; promoting fair labour laws; and providing BCBT's position on Labour Code improvements, funding for skilled trades training, enhanced training standards for asbestos abatement workers, and enforcement of employer responsibilities related to the deliberate misclassification of workers.
60. Kamloops Fire Fighters' Association IAFF Local 913 is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Labour and Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly to seek provincial coverage of custom pressure garments for all burn survivors in British Columbia, to seek amendments to WorkSafe legislation to include pre screening for presumptive cancers, and to seek enhanced presumptive cancer legislation.
61. Langley City Professional Firefighters is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly for firefighter presumptive cancers and latency periods, mandatory workplace cancer screening programs for firefighters, and funding for compression bandages and dressings for burn survivor patients.
62. National Council of Canadian Muslims is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding policies to enhance the security and safety of British Columbian Muslim communities and other at-risk communities given the rise in hate crimes, and policy initiatives related to combating Islamophobia and discrimination.
63. Port Alberni Professional Firefighters Association is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health and Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding changes to cancer latency periods and having all cancers be considered presumptive after 2 years, increasing presumptive cancer language to include all cancers for firefighters and reducing latency periods to 2 years, and having compression burn dressings covered by provincial health.

64. Revelstoke Professional Fire Fighters Association is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding funding of specialized burn dressings for burn victims, expansion of presumed cancers in firefighters, and implementation of a cancer/health screening program for firefighters.
65. Skeena Watershed Conservation Coalition is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding changes to freshwater fish management; the lack of adherence and clarity from provincial government processes by the BC Energy Regulator, Ministry of Environment and other relevant ministries on both the Prince Rupert Gas Transmission Pipeline Project and Ksi Lisims Liquefied Natural Gas Terminal environmental assessment process and related permitting; the lack of compliance and enforcement from the BC Oil and Gas Commission on the Coastal GasLink Pipeline; and for a more collaborative and community-based process to deal with increased violence in the upper Skeena communities (in the Hazeltons).
66. Sooke Teachers' Association is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Education and Childcare and Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding improved and safer teaching and learning conditions, improved public perception of teaching as a profession, increased funding for public education, poverty reduction strategies, and safe and inclusive schools for all students, including trans students.
67. Surfrider Foundation Canada Chapters is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding adding single-use plastic hotel amenities to the BC Single-Use and Plastic Waste Prevention Regulation; the establishment of a new British Columbia Coastal Protection Act as part of the Coastal Marine Strategy; establishing a legally binding code of practice under section 22 of the Environmental Management Act to set clear requirements for the plastic pellet industry, in line with international and federal best practices; municipal bylaws enabled under the Community Charter, including granting the District of Tofino and District of Ucluelet the authority to ban plastic coffee cups and lids and rigid bioplastic lids; restricting the use of polystyrene foam in floating structures in the aquatic environment; and the creation of a long-term vision for the Clean Coast Clean Waters shoreline cleanup and derelict vessel removal program.
68. Unilia (Canada) Fuel Cells Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding continued support to develop BC's hydrogen sector, and development of and amendments to regulations and policies related to demand, supply and infrastructure of the fuel cell electric vehicle market that de-risk early-stage private investment.

69. Vancouver Chinatown Foundation for Community Revitalization is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Tourism, Arts, Culture and Sport seeking funding for Vancouver Chinatown Foundation initiatives and projects.
70. Vernon Professional Firefighters' Association Local 1517 is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly to expand presumptive cancer coverage, improve firefighter health screening, and increase investment in burn care recovery.
71. View Royal Fire Fighters' Association, IAFF Local 5419 is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies to modernize presumptive cancer coverage by requesting amendments to the Workers Compensation Act to include all forms of cancer and reduce the cumulative employment requirement to two years, noting that British Columbia lags behind other provinces and the United States in covering cancers such as mesothelioma, laryngeal, and skin cancer, and that female firefighters face significantly higher risks of uterine and other reproductive cancers not currently covered.
72. Westport Fuel Systems Canada Inc. is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly and public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions regarding policies and programs relating to vehicle emissions and greenhouse gas standards for heavy-duty and light duty vehicles (commercial trucks, buses and light duty trucks) that would encourage the adoption of alternative fuel vehicles - specifically vehicles that use natural gas and/or hydrogen as a primary fuel.
