

WHO'S LOBBYING WHO IN BC?

Monthly Snapshot – May 2026

The following is a brief summary of new Registration Returns activated or re-activated between May 1 and May 31, 2026, under BC's *Lobbyists Transparency Act*.

Zach Authier, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of SECURE Waste Infrastructure Corp. regarding the development, interpretation, and implementation of environmental and energy regulations, policies, and regulatory processes related to industrial waste management, landfill operations, and environmental assessment requirements in British Columbia.
2. Michael Alvan Bailey, a consultant lobbyist with Western Policy Consultants Inc., is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Finance and the Office of the Premier on behalf of the M.H.A. Manufactured Housing Association of BC to advocate for clarification of an apparent revised interpretation of when manufactured homes qualify as real property versus tangible personal property for Provincial Sales Tax purposes.
3. Amanda van Baarsen, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health on behalf of Revera Inc. regarding long-term care in B.C.
4. Ameer Barber, a consultant lobbyist with 1495427 B.C. Ltd., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Canadian Fertility and Andrology Society regarding support of provincial engagement at the federal level to establish a national data registry for in vitro fertilization (IVF) outcome tracking, and encouraging the federal government to fulfill its platform commitment to fund

IVF treatments, and support for and engagement with British Columbia's provincial IVF program, including providing clinical validation and stakeholder input as the program evolves.

5. Amanda van Baarsen, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of British Columbia Hotel Association regarding clarity and predictability in tourism-related fiscal frameworks; New Hotel Development; targeted economic development to strengthen British Columbia's position as a preferred domestic and international travel destination; changes to the Property Assessment Model for Hotels; changes to the Temporary Foreign Worker (TFW) Program; strengthening training and education pathways to support long-term careers in hospitality; Government Cap on International Students; Labour and Workforce - Tourism Competitiveness; Provincial Nominee Program and workforce shortage in the BC Tourism and Hospitality sector; Rising Cost of Operations and Doing Business; and Short Term Rentals Policy and Affordable Housing.
6. James Cabangon, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Lyft Canada Inc. regarding the economic and social benefits of ridesharing in British Columbia, the Lyft business model, and employment and labour standards relating to the status of gig economy workers in British Columbia.
7. James Cabangon, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of NorthRiver Midstream Inc. regarding NorthRiver Midstream's infrastructure and the NEBC Connector Project and related regulations and permitting, and regarding climate action policies including the transition to an output-based pricing system.
8. Bilal Cheema, a consultant lobbyist with Cheema Strategies Incorporated, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Focus College regarding timely review and decision making on new educational program submissions to the Private Training Institutions Regulatory Unit, continued student aid support for domestic and foreign students, and a post secondary education system where Provincial Attestation Letters are equitably distributed and used for qualified educational programs.
9. Erin Co, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Enterprise Rent-A-Car Canada Company regarding clarification, modernization, and changes related to PST Bulletin 116, specifically its application to Canada's vehicle rental and short term leasing sector, proposed changes to the government's Electric Vehicle

mandate and ongoing revisions to the CleanBC program, and collaboration on managing transportation demand for preparations related to the FIFA World Cup 2026.

10. Linda Coady, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Standwell Forest Investments Ltd. to seek required government and regulatory approval for new investments in forest tenures, forest lands, wood processing and manufacturing facilities, forest carbon, biodiversity conservation, and forest and watershed restoration.
11. Rémi Courcelles, a consultant lobbyist with Consultation Esplanade Consulting Inc., is lobbying public office holders at the British Columbia Housing Management Commission and the Parliamentary Secretary for Gender Equity on behalf of Living with Pride Foundation regarding obtaining support from the Province and its agencies to help advance its Nelly's House project, which aims to create independent living housing and community spaces for British Columbia's 2SLGBTQIA+ seniors.
12. Christian von Donat, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the British Columbia Radiological Society regarding increasing and maintaining access to medical diagnostic imaging for patients through additional capital equipment, increasing sustainable funding for medical diagnostic imaging in British Columbia, increasing health human resource capacities, and maintaining current governance and compensation models for radiologists.
13. Leila Farmer, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Enterprise Rent-A-Car Canada Company regarding clarification, modernization and/or changes related to PST bulletin 116, specifically with regard to its application on Canada's vehicle rental/short-term leasing sector; proposed changes to the government's Electric Vehicle mandate and ongoing revisions to the CleanBC program; and collaborating on managing transportation demand for FIFA World Cup 2026 preparations.
14. Stephanie Gomes, a consultant lobbyist with NATIONAL Public Relations is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health on behalf of EMD Serono Canada regarding establishing long lasting relationships with government through meetings with targeted government officials and agencies to provide an overview of its current treatment offerings and how it has supported Canadian patients over the years, and to be available to support future decision making in its key therapeutic areas, primarily fertility, where possible from a policy standpoint.
15. Leah Holoiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Global Relay Communications Inc. seeking to

understand the provincial government's AI infrastructure and security solutions, policies related to digital sovereignty, and options for data security, as well as discussing the potential application of Global Relay's workflow automation tools in government operations, including triaging citizen requests, automatically classifying records, accelerating low risk approvals, enforcing consistent compliance checks, and reducing manual hand offs.

16. Grace Johnson, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Barrick Gold Corporation regarding advocacy efforts related to permitting and site remediation policies, as well as Barrick Gold's interest in supporting mineral, infrastructure, and economic development in British Columbia.
17. Gerrit Krueper, a consultant lobbyist with Kritical Thinking Consulting, is lobbying public office holders at the British Columbia Housing Management Commission and the Parliamentary Secretary for Gender Equity on behalf of Living with Pride Foundation regarding obtaining support from the Province and its agencies to help advance its Nelly's House project, which aims to create independent living housing and community spaces for British Columbia's 2SLGBTQIA+ seniors.
18. Sajjid Lakhani, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the Canadian Finance & Leasing Association regarding the creation of a sensible regulatory regime for vehicle protection products by aligning British Columbia's restricted insurance licensing framework with Alberta's to preserve consumer choice and access to affordable insurance and warranty products, the establishment of more flexible and aligned zero-emission vehicle targets by eliminating or better harmonizing provincial targets with the federal government's emissions-based approach to reflect evolving consumer preferences and technological advancements, and the digitization of commerce through the introduction of electronic chattel paper by enabling the perfection of a security interest electronically rather than through physical documentation, thereby reducing costs and improving security for businesses operating in the province.
19. Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public officer holders at several public agencies on behalf of B.C. Hospice/Palliative Care Association regarding funding to access hospice palliative care and services as well as funding for grief and bereavement services delivered by hospice societies.
20. Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of British Columbia Association of Speech Language

Pathologists and Audiologists regarding program recommendations to support communication health as it relates to education, health, children, and seniors.

21. Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of The British Columbia College of Family Physicians (A chapter of the college of family physicians of Canada) regarding supports for Family Doctors in British Columbia; working with Legislators and officials to address gaps and concerns in primary care delivery; and Doctor shortages, administrative burdens, and recruitment efforts.
22. Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the British Columbia Construction Association regarding policy direction on the development of employment training programs and feedback on Employment Standards legislation to ensure the ability of the British Columbia construction industry to remain competitive and have access to a suitable workforce; policies, programs, and initiatives that assist the government in achieving the stated objectives of the Community Benefit Agreement (CBA), but without policies that stifle competition and limit the choices of skilled tradespeople in BC; and seeking to develop public sector procurement capacity in accordance with the Guide to Calling Bids, Awarding Contracts and Trade Contractors Guide and Checklist and Guidance for the Release of Information and/or Documents Related to Competitive Procurement Opportunities; and to work with industry stakeholders to introduce Prompt Payment Legislation in BC.
23. Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public officer holders at several public agencies on behalf of Insurance Brokers Association of British Columbia regarding the impacts of natural catastrophes and related adverse weather on British Columbians and the insurance landscape, and educating and discussing the current auto insurance landscape in BC with policymakers.
24. Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Mortgage Brokers Association of British Columbia advocating for mortgage brokers and their clients including first-time homebuyers and those with mortgages; topics include supports for first-time homebuyers, the implementation of the Mortgage Services Act, and policies like the cooling-off period, property transfer tax, and other homebuying instruments.
25. Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Take a Hike Youth Mental Health Foundation regarding early

- intervention and early intervention mental health supports embedded in classrooms, and to seek funding to manage and expand early intervention and early intervention mental health programs.
26. Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Dan's Legacy Foundation to seek funding for clinically supported job-skills training for at-risk youth.

Kaitlyn Maloney, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Heating, Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Institute of Canada regarding Prompt Payment legislation and the compulsory trades system and trades training.
 28. Fraser McDonald, Juliette Castillo, and Kimberly Sterling, consultant lobbyists with StrategyCorp Inc., are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of SeatGeek Canada, Inc. regarding the live event entertainment sector, ticketing marketplace structures, and consumer protection.
 29. Ashley McDougall, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Mortgage Brokers Association of British Columbia advocating for mortgage brokers and their clients including first-time homebuyers and those with mortgages. Topics include supports for first-time homebuyers, the implementation of the Mortgage Services Act, and policies like the cooling-off period, property transfer tax, and other homebuying instruments.
 30. Christy (Nghì) Pham, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of MakeWay Charitable Society (Urban Climate Leadership project) seeking funding for workforce scaling and manufacturing innovation, and for financial support to stimulate private sector investment in heat pump retrofits for low rise buildings, and with policy and program recommendations regarding the government's stimulus response and provincial support measures regarding BC Coroner's report regarding 2021 heat dome deaths.
 31. Rishi Sharma, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Construction Foundation of BC (2012) Society regarding workforce development, apprenticeship completion, labour mobility, and skills training initiatives supporting British Columbia's construction and skilled trades sectors, including pathways to Red Seal certification, apprenticeship retention and completion supports, workforce participation and retention initiatives, skilled trades mental wellness supports, workforce readiness for major projects, partnerships with training institutions, WorkBC alignment, labour market participation, provincial program and policy

alignment, and potential provincial funding or financial support for skilled trades workforce initiatives and related community infrastructure projects.

32. Jesse Shea, a consultant lobbyist with Enterprise Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Movember Foundation regarding securing buy in from provincial governments, including the Government of British Columbia, for a national strategy focused on men's health, including testicular cancer, prostate cancer, suicide prevention, and Indigenous health and well being.
33. Moe Singh Sihota, a consultant lobbyist with Parhar Investments & Consulting Ltd., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of MNP LLP regarding expanding cross ministry government awareness of its consulting capacities.
34. Dev Singh, a consultant lobbyist with Sandstone Group, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Transportation and Transit on behalf of Air Line Pilots Association, International (Canada) / Association des Pilotes de Ligne, Internationale (Canada) regarding federal flight time, duty time, and fatigue management regulations for commercial pilots, including potential exemptions or relief measures and their implications for aviation safety, regional air access, and pilot working conditions.
35. Katie Shaw and Justin Bérubé, consultant lobbyists with Falkirk Consulting, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Nordex Energy Canada ULC regarding Nordex Canada Inc.'s participation in British Columbia's clean energy sector, including renewable electricity policy, procurement of new generation, and the regulatory and permitting frameworks applicable to wind energy development in British Columbia, in support of the Province's energy supply and climate objectives and to contribute industry expertise to relevant policy and program discussions.
36. Kimberly Sterling, a consultant lobbyist with StrategyCorp Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Quebecor Media Inc. regarding Québecor's intention to make representations to the British Columbia government, or any provincial entity, concerning the development, establishment, or termination of any program, policy, directive, or guideline that would foster competition and enable Vidéotron to expand its telecommunications services.
37. Sean Webster, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Jobs and Economic Growth and the Parliamentary Secretary for Trade to the Minister of Jobs and Economic Growth on behalf of Aurora Cannabis Inc. regarding funding for the renovation of an existing production facility to enable increased exports of medical cannabis to international markets.
38. Matt Williamson, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs, is lobbying public office

holders at several public agencies on behalf of SECURE Waste Infrastructure Corp. regarding development, interpretation, and implementation of environmental and energy regulations, policies, and regulatory processes related to industrial waste management, landfill operations, and environmental assessment requirements in British Columbia.

39. Onsum Woo, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of LaunchLife International Inc. regarding seeking to reinforce positive relationships with government officials, demonstrate the value its premier education brands bring to the Canadian economy and the communities in which they operate, and advocate for steady government funding.
40. Dan Woynillowicz, a consultant lobbyist with Polaris Strategy + Insight is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Clean Economy Fund regarding the New Economy Canada initiative aimed at accelerating investment, capital deployment, and job creation in British Columbia's clean economy, including discussions on investment attraction strategies.
41. BC Association of Community Response Networks is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding funding sources and guidelines and sharing current statistics province-wide, continuing funding for the BC CRN, and continuing funding for the Council to Reduce Elder Abuse(CREA) for which funds are received by the BC Association of Community Response Networks (BC CRN).
42. The Christian Labour Association of Canada is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding apprenticeship training and funding models to ensure British Columbians have access to the training needed to be well positioned for future jobs; mental health and addiction programs designed to support workers dealing with PTSD and other mental health related conditions; restrictive tendering practices known as Community Benefit Agreements, Special Project Needs Agreements, and other restrictive Project Labour Agreements, including fair and open tendering for all British Columbians; and balanced Labour Code reform aimed at ensuring workers' rights to choose are respected and upheld regardless of union affiliation.
43. Citizens for My Sea to Sky Society is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding climate policies and programs in British Columbia; its campaign calling for the cancellation of permits and elimination of subsidies for Woodfibre LNG and the associated Eagle Mountain to Woodfibre Gas Pipeline proposed by FortisBC; and education and awareness related to the human health impacts of LNG in British Columbia.

44. Clean Economy Fund is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding the New Economy Canada initiative and policies aimed at accelerating investment, capital deployment, job creation, and investment attraction in British Columbia's clean economy, as well as tariff response recommendations to support economic growth through supply chain initiatives related to the buildout of British Columbia's electricity grid, manufacturing capacity in British Columbia and across Canada, and the use of "Buy BC and Canada" materials.
45. CUPE Local 1091 is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Education and Child Care regarding EA's supporting students in schools, fully funding children with designated needs, violence in the workplace resulting from a lack of supports for students, and providing an EA in every K to 3 classroom for early intervention.
46. Drax Group is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Forests regarding challenges in accessing fibre, and exploring whether previously launched Ministry programs could form part of a potential solution.
47. The Governing Council of the Salvation Army in Canada / Conseil de direction de l'Armée du Salut du Canada is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding the government's decision concerning an existing grant for the organization's free dental clinic.
48. Kamloops Mazda is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding zero-emission vehicle mandates and policies.
49. Kiwassa Neighbourhood Services Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding IRCC funding cuts affecting settlement work and collaboration with settlement sector partners to identify solutions for settlement issues for the attention of local and federal governments; local community and neighbourhood needs arising from the changing needs of newcomer communities, government funding cuts to community programs, and the impact of shrinking budgets on neighbourhood house operations; new childcare spaces, including advocacy for a collaborative approach in Surrey and support for \$10/day programs; funding to support the continuation of deeply affordable housing for families in East Vancouver; the role and importance of neighbourhood houses in the Province, including the desire to build the profile of neighbourhood houses among provincial decision-makers so they remain top of mind if and when additional funding becomes available; and universal child care.
50. Mazda Canada Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding zero-emission vehicle mandates and policies.

51. MVZEIF is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies to seek funding to support climate action programs and initiatives that align with the CleanBC Plan and Keep It Cool Initiative, including multi family building retrofits.
52. Open Regenerative Technologies Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions regarding further investment in the provision of heat pumps to low rise multi-unit residential buildings in British Columbia.
53. Private Forest Landowners Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding changes to forestry policies or programs, assessment and tax policies, and international trade related matters on private forest land management in BC; Managed Forest land assessment and taxation; input to processes that include Managed Forest Private lands (Private Managed Forest Land Act), including Managed Forest Review and other environmental reviews; and promotion of fair economic opportunities for private forest landowners.
54. Teck Resources Limited is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding biodiversity and wildlife management by supporting integrated approaches to land use that minimize and mitigate impacts to biodiversity and wildlife; carbon tax measures that achieve greenhouse gas emissions reductions while supporting the competitiveness of emissions-intensive, trade-exposed sectors compared to other mining jurisdictions; climate action policies that advance the world's transition to a low-carbon economy; critical minerals initiatives that advance critical mineral production, processing and recycling in the province; cumulative effects management policies that ensure environmental protection while enabling provincial permits; energy competitiveness initiatives that maintain and improve British Columbia's low-carbon electricity system as a competitive advantage; Indigenous affairs initiatives that advance reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples and facilitate further relationship and capacity building; innovation policies and programs supporting the adoption and use of new technologies in mining; international trade actions that facilitate exports to key markets abroad; land conservation actions relating to nature-positive objectives, land management and wildlife habitat; land use planning actions relating to sustainable natural resource stewardship and the planning and management of provincial public land; mine operations actions relating to sustainable mining operations in the province; mine permitting amendments to improve the efficiency and clarity of permitting policies and processes; project development initiatives that seek to improve the efficiency, effectiveness and outcomes of mining-specific and mining-related projects; providing information regarding the announcement of Anglo

American's proposed merger with Teck relevant to obtaining support for Investment Canada Act approval; reclamation securities policies that are reasonably feasible with respect to payment structure and other aspects; regulatory processes that are rigorous, predictable and timely; species at risk legislation that provides clarity on how at-risk populations and habitats are managed by the province; supply chain actions that advance supply chain efficiency and resiliency; provincial tax measures that are competitive compared to other mining jurisdictions; transportation initiatives supporting the green transportation sector in British Columbia; and a long-term approach to address the management of naturally occurring substances released by mining activities that affect water quality.

55. Terry Fox Humanitarian Awards Inc. / Prix Humanitaires Terry Fox Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies seeking funding for post-secondary scholarships.
56. Vancouver Island Construction Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding capital infrastructure investment priorities, transportation infrastructure, public construction projects, and economic development initiatives impacting Vancouver Island and British Columbia; climate resilience, low-carbon construction practices, energy policy, electrification, utility infrastructure, and sustainable building initiatives affecting the construction and development industry; housing affordability, development approval processes, municipal permitting timelines, regulatory efficiency, and policies intended to accelerate housing and infrastructure delivery across British Columbia; implementation and modernization of the BC Building Code, construction regulations, permitting requirements, and industry compliance initiatives; Indigenous participation, procurement opportunities, workforce inclusion, and partnership development within British Columbia's construction industry; public procurement policies, fair and open tendering practices, bid transparency, contractor prequalification, and infrastructure procurement processes for publicly funded construction projects in British Columbia; skilled trades workforce development, apprenticeship training, labour shortages, immigration pathways, workforce participation, and construction industry recruitment and retention initiatives; and seeking government funding, grant support, and program partnerships for the Tailgate Toolkit initiative and related construction industry mental health, substance use, and workplace harm reduction programs.
57. Woodside Energy International (Canada) Ltd is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding a robust framework to support Carbon Capture and Storage; British Columbia's Output-Based Pricing System, including provisions to enable compliance flexibility while maintaining

competitiveness for industrial emitters; British Columbia's regulatory requirements for well and pipeline dormancy and shutdown, including potential extensions or exemptions; habitat and population management actions to meet recovery goals while accounting for PNG resource access and egress; the design and implementation of British Columbia's New Royalty Framework, with a focus on maintaining fiscal competitiveness and ensuring investment certainty; and the development of a comprehensive, efficient, and credible carbon offset system in British Columbia that supports additional emissions reductions while maintaining economic competitiveness.

58. Wood Preservation Canada is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies advocating that the Government of British Columbia engage with the federal government to support timely approval of critical wood preservatives and modernization of the Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) regulatory framework to help ensure a stable domestic supply of treated wood, and for provincial policies and programs that support the transition to alternative wood preservatives in the forestry and wood products sector, including measures related to workforce stability and the delivery of infrastructure projects such as housing and electricity transmission.
59. WORLD WILDLIFE FUND CANADA/FONDS MONDIAL POUR LA NATURE CANADA is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Water, Land and Resource Stewardship regarding policy and programs related to the restoration and stewardship of the natural environment within British Columbia.
