

# WHO'S LOBBYING WHO IN BC?

## Monthly Snapshot – June 2026

The following is a brief summary of new Registration Returns activated or re-activated between June 1 and June 30, 2026, under BC's *Lobbyists Transparency Act*.

1. Zach Authier, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Instacart regarding policy and legislation related to provincial consumer privacy protection and data governance.
2. Ameer Barber, a consultant lobbyist with 1495427 B.C. Ltd., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Clipper Navigation Limited regarding discussion of the proposed lease terms for FRS Clipper with respect to the Belleville Terminal Redevelopment Project with the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, and discussion of the potential operational cost impacts on ferry operators such as FRS Clipper, as well as the broader implications for cross-border tourism.
3. Nicole Brassard, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs, is lobbying Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly and public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions on behalf of General Fusion Inc. regarding funding for R&D toward commercialization of made-in-BC fusion technology.
4. James Cabangon, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of 3M Canada Company to introduce the company, its products and services; regarding British Columbia's COVID-19 pandemic response and recovery, including personal protective equipment supply chain management, and future emergency preparedness; engaging on matters relating to policies and legislative proposals addressing public health and safety, including

population-level harms; enhancing safety of motorists on BC roadways through available 3M technologies and programs focused on road, road user, and road worker safety; enhancing workplace safety through the introduction to available 3M technologies and personal safety devices; and to present 3M energy technology solutions to reduce the weight of power transmission lines, increase efficiency and capacity of transmission and distribution systems while keeping actual infrastructure.

5. James Cabangon, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of S.C. Johnson & Son Inc. regarding the CleanBC Plastic Action Plan and to ensure intended product usage is considered in future regulations from the province.
6. Ryan Cole, a consultant lobbyist with Policy Concepts Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the Responsible Gambling Council of Canada regarding the need for sustainable program funding and policies related to best practices for internet gambling product standards, product measurement and evaluation, consumer education programs, and advertising standards that promote responsible play in an online gaming environment.
7. Jordon Daniels and Sebastian Jdrzejewski, consultant lobbyists with StrategyCorp Inc., are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Fish Wildlife Habitat Coalition advocating for biodiversity and ecosystem health, including the restoration and long-term sustainability of fish, wildlife, and habitat in British Columbia.
8. Siera Draper and Jack Baker, consultant lobbyists with NorthStar Public Affairs, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Flix Canada ULC regarding policies, regulations, and legislative measures affecting intercity passenger transportation services, including opportunities to improve transportation connectivity, support tourism and economic development, reduce barriers to service expansion, and facilitate greater mobility between British Columbia and other Canadian jurisdictions.
9. Mitchell Goldie, a consultant lobbyist with Crestview Strategy, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of LaunchLife International Inc. regarding reinforcing positive relationships with government officials, demonstrating the value that its premier education brands bring to the Canadian economy and the communities in which they operate, and advocating for stable government funding.
10. Steve Greenaway, a consultant lobbyist with Counsel Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of British Columbia Hotel Association regarding New Hotel Development; clarity and predictability in tourism-related fiscal frameworks; targeted

economic development to strengthen British Columbia's position as a preferred domestic and international travel destination; changes to the Property Assessment Model for Hotels; changes to the Temporary Foreign Worker (TFW) Program; to strengthen training and education pathways to support long-term careers in hospitality; Government Cap on International Students; Labour and Workforce - Tourism Competitiveness; Provincial Nominee Program and workforce shortage in the BC Tourism and Hospitality sector; Rising Cost of Operations and Doing Business; and Short Term Rentals Policy and Affordable Housing.

11. Nicola Hill, a consultant lobbyist with Hilltop Public Affairs Corp., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Aspen Community Developments Ltd. seeking funding and partnership for an innovative model for purpose-built rental, embedded-affordability ownership, and workforce housing models aimed at households who are underserved by the conventional market.
12. Nicola Hill, a consultant lobbyist with Hilltop Public Affairs Corp., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of WELL Health Technologies Corp. regarding discussions about the company's role as a proudly BC-founded and headquartered partner in relieving administrative burdens, modernizing care delivery, and supporting frontline providers in the health care system.
13. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the Canadian Mental Health Association BC Division regarding advocacy for changes to the Mental Health Act, Police Act, and other statutes with implications for people living with mental health and substance use problems, as well as policy and program recommendations regarding the government's approach to community-based mental health and substance use services, including the provision of housing for populations served by the Canadian Mental Health Association BC Division, and government spending in the area of mental health and substance use care.
14. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Teranet Holdings LP regarding a proposed alternative service delivery model for the Property Registry and other government registry services, with a focus on modernization, service efficiency, user experience, access, and opportunities to support improved long-term outcomes for government and registry users.
15. Leah Holiday, a consultant lobbyist with GT & Company Executive Advisors, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of James Holdings Ltd. regarding exploring avenues for provincial financial support for housing projects.

16. Mark Jiles, a consultant lobbyist with Bluestone Government Relations, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the Tourism Industry Association of British Columbia regarding changes to, amendments of, or the elimination of policies and regulations affecting the tourism industry in British Columbia, as well as financial support for and investment in tourism programs and initiatives.
17. Mark Jiles and Rob Nagai, consultant lobbyists with Bluestone Government Relations, are lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of the Delta Hospital and Community Health Foundation regarding work on the repaving of the Delta Hospital Long Term Care Centre.
18. Graham Kissack, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of EDP Renewables Canada Ltd. to discuss a BC energy project and how it relates to the upcoming 2026 BC Hydro call for power and battery storage.
19. Taylor Kyte, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs Inc., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of SAP Canada Inc. to discuss opportunities related to modernizing human resources and corporate services.
20. David MacLean, a consultant lobbyist with Earncliffe Strategies, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health on behalf of Insulet Canada Corporation to support coverage for the omnipod five automated insulin delivery device under the BC pharmacare regime.
21. Rob Leone, a consultant lobbyist with VOSAVIS, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health and the Office of the Premier on behalf of OceanMD regarding expanding eReferral and Patient Engagement digital health services in the province of British Columbia.
22. Joshua Matthewman and Yelizaveta Vasylyshyna, consultant lobbyists with Temple Scott Associates Inc., are lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Agriculture and Food on behalf of Farmers for Climate Solutions to advocate for the inclusion of policies and programs that support regenerative practices and environmentally and economically resilient outcomes in the next Agricultural Policy Framework.
23. Ashley McDougall, a consultant lobbyist with Impact Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of The British Columbia College of Family Physicians (A chapter of the college of family physicians of Canada) regarding supports for family doctors in British Columbia, working with legislators and officials to address gaps and concerns in primary care delivery, doctor shortages, administrative burdens, and recruitment efforts.

24. Michael McKinnon, a consultant lobbyist with Enterprise Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Ticketmaster Canada LP to create awareness of Ticketmaster's role in the Canadian live event marketplace and discuss the government's ongoing consideration of measures to protect consumers in live event ticketing.
25. Michael McKinnon, a consultant lobbyist with Enterprise Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Live Nation Canada Inc. to build awareness of Live Nation's role in the Canadian live event marketplace and discuss opportunities to grow arts and cultural experiences.
26. Hugues Mousseau, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Belron Canada inc. regarding steps to amend the Business Practices and Consumer Protection Act to implement the right to repair in the automotive sector and improve BC drivers' access to aftermarket services.
27. Rob Nagai, a consultant lobbyist with Bluestone Government Relations, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of British Columbia Notary Association regarding the BC Mortgage Broker's Act advocating for changes to allow them a greater role and responsibility in delivering services for real estate transactions, and regarding BC's Legal Professions Act to continue to clarify their role and responsibilities in BC's legal system.
28. Robert Prins, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Forests on behalf of the Council of Forest Industries regarding forest management policies and regulations.
29. Rosalind Robertson, a consultant lobbyist with Earncliffe Strategies, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Health on behalf of Insulet Canada Corporation to inform elected officials and senior decision-makers about the Omnipod 5 insulin pump technology and its role in the treatment of diabetes; to promote market access to new and emerging diabetes devices and technologies, including phamacare; and to request meetings and contacts regarding BC's ongoing diabetes strategic planning.
30. Raj Sihota, a consultant lobbyist with Strategies 360 Canada, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Petal Solutions Inc. regarding the provision and potential expansion of scheduling and medical billing solutions, including alignment with provincial healthcare policies and programs related to digital health infrastructure, system efficiency, and access to primary care.

31. Zoie Sutherland, a consultant lobbyist with First Lake Solutions, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of NASSCO, Inc. advancing infrastructure discussions around the repair and replacement of underground piping and the use of trenchless technologies to extend the lifespan of existing water and wastewater infrastructure.
32. Darryl Tempest, a consultant lobbyist, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of HRC Innovations Inc. regarding cannabis excise policy and differentiated treatment for outdoor cannabis cultivation, legal market competitiveness, environmental sustainability, agricultural diversification, rural economic development, illicit market displacement, and related provincial and federal policy considerations.
33. Bill Tieleman, a consultant lobbyist with West Star Communications, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Strata Corporation LMS 4157 regarding the opposition of three strata properties and their residents to plans to establish an Overdose Prevention Site at 900 Helmcken Street, Vancouver, and concerns about the associated risks to public safety and security.
34. Ken Veldman, a consultant lobbyist with Prairie Sky Enterprises Ltd., is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Vopak Development Canada Holdings Inc. to discuss the development of a favourable policy framework that encourages natural gas development and energy exports to foreign markets.
35. Steve Vander Wal, a consultant lobbyist with Rocky Point Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies on behalf of Medical Technology Association of Canada (Medtech Canada) regarding Provincial policies, programs, funding decisions and procurement practices related to the adoption, assessment, reimbursement and implementation of medical technologies, medical devices and diagnostic technologies within British Columbia's healthcare system.
36. Matt Williamson, a consultant lobbyist with Global Public Affairs, is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions and the Office of the Premier on behalf of ConocoPhillips Canada Resources Corp. regarding the advancement of policy discussions and advocacy efforts to support industrial electrification and competitiveness in North Eastern BC's oil and gas sector.
37. Automotive Retailers Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding rate harmonization between RoadSafetyBC and ICBC; the definition and licensing requirements of micromobility vehicles; mandatory trade certification requirements for automotive industry workers; and the development and updating of policies, procedures, and service delivery standards related to

the provision of services to insured motorists in British Columbia. The Association is also providing input to ICBC on behalf of the automotive industry, including the collision repair, glass repair and replacement, towing, and recycling sectors, as well as matters related to labour attraction, training requirements, and the application of existing service terms. In addition, it is sharing information and recommendations regarding vehicle safety inspections, including support for compulsory inspections and inspections upon the sale of a vehicle; engaging with the Ministry of Environment on the recycling of electric vehicle batteries and the environmental hazards associated with abandoned recreational vehicles; and working with the provincial government on policies and incentive programs related to used electric vehicles, EV charging infrastructure, EV lifecycle management, and business participation in government-funded incentive programs, while offering its expertise to support the planning and implementation of these initiatives.

38. BALLARD POWER SYSTEMS INC. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding the adoption of zero-emissions and transitional low-emissions vehicles powered by hydrogen across government fleets and provincial Crown corporations, including public transit; partnering with industry, academic institutions, and community organizations to launch a coordinated awareness-raising and public outreach initiative; providing support for the expansion of fueling station development programs and projects to ensure they accommodate a broad range of end uses and help diversify hydrogen market opportunities; seeking funding from the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions, including communicating with government officials about potential financial support for clean technologies, including hydrogen fuel cells for mobility and stationary applications and the hydrogen value stream that supports them; streamlining regulatory and permitting processes for hydrogen projects to ensure timely project development; and supporting the integration of hydrogen into the energy mix to advance climate action and foster economic diversification by creating new opportunities from British Columbia's natural resources. The Hydrogen Strategy aims to leverage British Columbia's renewable energy and natural gas resources, geological storage capacity, and innovative technologies to make the province a global hub for hydrogen innovation, and Hydrogen BC, the British Columbia affiliate of the Canadian Hydrogen Association, commends the province's continued commitment to fostering the growth of the hydrogen sector by prioritizing the immediate expansion of production, the establishment of regional hubs, and the creation of hydrogen regulatory frameworks.

39. The Canada Life Assurance Company is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding advocacy on the availability of virtual health care services in the province, particularly the employer-funded model; amendments to legislation to enable auto-enrolment and auto-escalation for retirement benefits, as well as retirement decumulation options; public policy related to the regulation of insurance activities, with the intended outcome of developing policies and regulations that protect the public from potential harms while enabling Canada Life to continue supporting clients and developing its business; determining the provincial position on national drug coverage and advocating for universal drug coverage through a mixed-payer program; fair treatment of customers and sales compensation practices in the insurance industry; harmonization of securities and insurance industry practices, including the new securities industry self-regulatory organization; insurance intermediary licensing and oversight, including restricted insurance agency licensing and requirements; securities distribution intermediary issues, including incorporated persons and dual registrants; implementation of new rules and regulations under the Financial Institutions Act; and the pricing, dispensing, and availability of specialty medications, with the intended outcome of ensuring that these drugs remain accessible for B.C. residents.
40. Cenovus Energy Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions and Member(s) of the BC Legislative Assembly regarding the provincial distribution of federal Asset Retirement Obligation (ARO) funds, including concerns that work undertaken to address Phase 1 obligations, including government-identified nominated sites, could consume funding intended to support Phase 2 of the program; discussions regarding potential policy levers to enable pathways to net zero; discussions regarding the design and implementation of the Ecological Suitable Species Guidelines; discussions with regulators on improving and aligning combustion technical standards across provincial and federal jurisdictions; and policy and program recommendations regarding the government's oil and gas royalties program within the Environment and Climate portfolio.
41. Delta Hospital and Community Health Foundation is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding the advancement of healthcare initiatives and facilities in Delta.
42. Deep Sea Trawlers Association of B.C. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding the reinstatement of the Provincial Motor Fuel Tax exemption for British Columbia commercial seafood harvesters and the economic impacts of fuel taxation on the commercial fishing sector, including the development of policies or programs to improve the competitiveness and viability of British Columbia seafood harvesting businesses.

43. FlixBus Canada, ULC is lobbying public office holders at Destination BC Corp and the Ministry of Transportation and Transit regarding liberalization of intercity bus transport policy and regulation.
44. GTMA Canada Global Health Association is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding changes to ICBC policies and TFWP SAWP program Agriculture Stream.
45. Hyfluence Systems Corp is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions regarding updates to BC's hydrogen strategy, and the state of the hydrogen sector and outlined opportunities for future growth and continued support in the context of CleanBC, the Zero Emissions Vehicle Act, and permitting or regulatory efficiencies.
46. INSTITUTE FOR HEALTH SYSTEM TRANSFORMATION & SUSTAINABILITY is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Health regarding exploring ways for the Government of British Columbia to turn promising ideas into evidence-informed, system-embedded solutions that make measurable improvements in health and care across the province, and seeking ongoing support for initiatives related to Type 2 Diabetes and Palliative Care.
47. Middle Ground Consult AI Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies to raise awareness of, and seek pilot opportunities, procurement, and adoption of the Middle Ground software platform across multiple provincial ministries and provincial entities whose mandates include public stakeholder engagement, consultation, and Indigenous consultation.
48. Midwives Association of BC is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding Cross-sector collaboration related to family, reproductive, and community health; Digital health access and interoperability, including CareConnect access for community midwives; Expansion and sustainability of midwifery services across British Columbia; Funding, administration, and sustainability of professional programs and supports for midwives; Health human resources, recruitment, retention, and workforce planning related to midwifery; Indigenous midwifery and Indigenous-led sexual, reproductive, and newborn healthcare models; Maternal and newborn health policy and health system transformation initiatives; Midwifery education pathways, student supports, and leadership development; Midwives' workplace classification and occupational health matters; Public awareness and understanding of the role of midwives within BC's healthcare system; Regulatory, legal, and system-level issues impacting midwifery practice and healthcare delivery; and Rural and remote maternity care access and sustainability.
49. Paramount Resources Ltd. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding British Columbia's regulatory requirements for well and pipeline dormancy and shutdown, including

potential extensions or exemptions; habitat and population management measures to achieve recovery objectives while considering petroleum and natural gas resource access and egress; relations with Indigenous Peoples, including treaty rights, environmental matters, and opportunities for collaboration; the design and implementation of British Columbia's New Royalty Framework, with a focus on maintaining fiscal competitiveness and investment certainty; and the development of a comprehensive, efficient, and credible carbon offset system that supports additional emissions reductions while maintaining economic competitiveness.

50. Petal Solutions Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding the provision and potential expansion of scheduling and medical billing solutions, including alignment with provincial healthcare policies and programs related to digital health infrastructure, system efficiency, and access to primary care.
51. Rivian Automotive Canada, Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding recommendations to the provincial government on matters of policy, programs, regulations, and decisions to support the growth of British Columbia's zero-emission vehicle supply chain, and providing input on government policy, programs, regulations, and decisions related to the Zero-Emission Vehicles Act to support consumer adoption of zero-emission vehicles in British Columbia.
52. Second Harvest is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding funding and/or policy changes to support the ongoing distribution of surplus food to individuals and communities facing food insecurity.
53. Tax Executives Institute, Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding administrative, technical, and policy recommendations on matters related to the Provincial Carbon Tax Act, the Provincial Motor Fuel Tax Act, and the Provincial Sales Tax Act.
54. Thesis Gold and Silver Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding BC Hydro infrastructure planning for the proposed Lawyers-Ranch Project and alternatives for site power generation if grid connected power is either delayed or unavailable, and land use planning in the Toodoggone region and its implications for proposed mineral development projects.
55. Unilia (Canada) Fuel Cells Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding support to develop BC's hydrogen sector and the development of and amendments to regulations and policies related to demand, supply and infrastructure of the fuel cell electric vehicle market that de-risk early-stage private investment.

56. Vermilion Energy Inc. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Energy and Climate Solutions regarding changes to royalty regulations for oil and gas produced in BC.
57. Vopak Development Canada Holdings Inc. is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies to discuss the development of a favourable policy framework that encourages natural gas development and energy exports to foreign markets.
58. WCG International Consultants Ltd. is lobbying public office holders at the Ministry of Children and Family Development regarding opportunities to align WCG Services' priorities with those of the Province of British Columbia, including the delivery of community-based services for families and children and youth with disabilities.
59. 411 Seniors Centre Society (1977) is lobbying public office holders at several public agencies regarding programs and services for older adults at 411 Seniors Centre and more broadly at the municipal, provincial, and federal levels, and seeking funding for 411 Seniors Society programs and services, including its Navigation and Peer Support service and other programs and services.
